**Summary Information**

**Overview.** The bill requires the Department of Public Safety to apply for federal grant funding associated with the state’s response to mass shootings.

## Summary of Legislation

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The bill adds applying for, accepting, and expending federal or other available grant money for improving the state's response to mass shootings to the list of duties of the Division of Criminal Justice within the Department of Public Safety.

## State Expenditures

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Starting in FY 2025-26, workload to the Department of Public Safety will increase to apply for more grants. The fiscal note assumes this work can be accomplished within existing resources. To the extent additional federal grants are rewarded, the department will accept and expend that funding to improve the state's response to mass shootings.

## Effective Date

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The bill was signed into law by the Governor on April 10, 2025, and takes effect on August 6, 2025, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
