A BILL FOR AN ACT CONCERNING THE WILDFIRE MATTERS REVIEW COMMITTEE, AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, DEFERRING THE DATE ON WHICH THE COMMITTEE IS SCHEDULED TO REPEAL AND MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Wildfire Matters Review Committee. The wildfire matters review committee (WMRC) is currently scheduled to repeal on July 1, 2018. The bill defers the repeal date to September 1, 2025.

The bill also eliminates obsolete provisions relating to the WMRC's consideration of codifying the wildland and prescribed fire advisory commission, an entity created by executive order. The WMRC discharged its obligation by considering this issue during the 2014 legislative session.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 2-3-1602, amend (7); and repeal (1.5) as follows:

2-3-1602. Wildfire matters review committee - creation - repeal of part. (1.5) (a) In 2014, in addition to any other matters it considers, the committee shall consider the creation of a Colorado wildland and prescribed fire advisory commission under the division of fire prevention and control in the department of public safety, also referred to in this subsection (1.5) as the "advisory commission". The purpose of the advisory commission will be to assist the director of the division of fire prevention and control in performing his or her duties. The committee shall make specific findings and recommendations regarding the appropriate composition of the advisory commission, length of terms, and the types of expertise and interests that should be represented.

(b) On or before December 1, 2014, the committee shall submit its specific recommendations pertaining to the advisory commission to the agriculture, livestock, and natural resources committee of the house of representatives and the agriculture, natural resources, and energy committee of the senate, or any successor committees. Nothing in this paragraph (b) prevents the committee from proposing legislation regarding the creation of the advisory commission.

3	SECTION 2. Appropriation. (1) For the 2018-19 state fiscal
4	year, \$49,125 is appropriated to the legislative department. This
5	appropriation is from the general fund. To implement this act, the

7	(a) \$41,484 for use by the legislative council, which amount is
8	based on an assumption that the legislative council will require an
9	additional 0.3FTE; and
10	(b) \$7,641 for use by the office of legislative legal services, which
11	amount is based on an assumption that the office will require an
12	additional 0.1 FTE.
13	SECTION <u>3.</u> Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
14	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
15	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
