A BILL FOR AN ACT

Bill Summary

Currently, regular special district elections are held on the Tuesday immediately succeeding the first Monday of May in every even-numbered

HOUSE 2nd Reading Unamended February 5, 2018 year. Commencing in 2023, the bill moves such elections to the Tuesday following the first Monday of May in odd-numbered years.

In order to implement the new date on which regular special district elections will be held, **section 4** of the bill provides that the directors elected at the special district elections held in 2020 and 2022 will serve 3-year terms.

Section 5 makes a conforming amendment to the "Rail District Act of 1982", which uses the same election schedule as provided for special district directors.

Definitions.** As used in this code, unless the context 5 otherwise requires: 6 (42) "Regular special district election" means the election on the 7 Tuesday succeeding the first Monday of May in every even-numbered 8 ODD-NUMBERED year, held for the purpose of electing members to the 9 board of special districts and for submission of ballot issues, if any. 10 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 1-13.5-111, amend 11 (1) as follows: 12 1-13.5-111. Time for holding elections for special districts -13 **type of election - manner of election - notice.** (1) Except as otherwise 14 provided in subsection (4) of this section, regular special district elections 15 must be held on the Tuesday succeeding the first Monday of May in every 16 even-numbered ODD-NUMBERED year. 17 **SECTION 3.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 32-1-103, amend the 18 introductory portion and (17) as follows: 19 **32-1-103. Definitions.** As used in this article ARTICLE 1, unless 20 the context otherwise requires:

24	SECTION 6. Effective date. This act takes effect upon passage;
25	except that sections 1, 2, 3, and 5 of this act take effect July 1, 2022.
26	SECTION 7. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
27	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the

ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August 1 2 8, 2018, if adjournment sine die is on May 9, 2018); except that, if a 3 referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the 4 state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act 5 within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect 6 unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in November 2018 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the 7 8

official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
