Summary of Legislation

The bill repeals the authority of the Division of Criminal Justice in the Department of Public Safety (CDPS) to transfer up to 10 percent of annual appropriations for community corrections program services among or between line items. It also authorizes over expenditures of up to \$2 million for felony placements in community corrections programs.

State Expenditures

Relative to current law, the bill potentially increases state General Fund expenditures in the CDPS by up to \$2.0 million per year by authorizing over expenditures for felony placements in community corrections programs. It does not change programs and so no appropriation is required.

Effective Date

This bill was signed into law by the Governor on June 3, 2025. It took effect on July 1, 2025.
