101      **CONCERNING COLORADO "PUBLIC LANDS DAY", AND, IN CONNECTION**  
102                **THEREWITH, RECOGNIZING MAY 15, 2021, AS THE FIFTH ANNUAL**

1                WHEREAS, In May 2016, Colorado became the first state in the  
2      nation to establish a state holiday for our public lands when the Colorado  
3      General Assembly passed a bill establishing the third Saturday in May as  
4      "Public Lands Day"; and

5                WHEREAS, The bill passed with bipartisan support and was  
6      signed into law by Governor Hickenlooper, and the inaugural event was  
7      celebrated on May 20, 2017; and

8                WHEREAS, "Public Lands Day" is a day to celebrate our public  
9      lands as vital resources providing clean water, protecting wildlife
