# **Summary of Legislation**

Under current law, life care institutions charge a one-time fee for lifetime access to services in a residential facility and are regulated by the Department of Regulatory Agencies (DORA). The bill allows these institutions to provide limited services in a community setting or in a private residence, places disclosure requirements on these service contracts, and specifies when they may be canceled and refunded.

## **State Expenditures**

DORA currently regulates the six life care institutions that operate in Colorado. Workload will increase to regulate their community-based services in accordance with the bill. Given the limited number of such life care institutions, the work is expected to be minimal.

### **Effective Date**

The bill was signed into law by the Governor on May 19, 2024, and takes effect on August 6, 2025, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
