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**A BILL FOR AN ACT**

101      **CONCERNING EXPANDING WORK-BASED LEARNING EXPERIENCES IN**  
102      **HIGHER EDUCATION.**

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**Bill Summary**

*(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill creates the work-based learning consortium pilot program (pilot program) in the department of higher education (department). The purpose of the pilot program is to develop and expand the integration of work-based learning experiences for students enrolled in higher education.

On or before July 1, 2026, or within 90 days after the department

receives sufficient funding, the department shall convene a consortium consisting of a group of representatives from institutions of higher education to:

- Share best practices on improving access to quality work-based learning opportunities for students;
- Help participating institutions of higher education meet workforce needs in Colorado and connect academic learning with real-world experiences through career preparation and skill development for students; and
- Make recommendations to the general assembly and institutions of higher education on the best practices.

Subject to available appropriations, at the end of the 3-year pilot program, the consortium shall complete and submit a report to the education committees of the house of representatives and the senate, or their successor committees. The report must include:

- A description of the consortium's findings and recommendations;
- Details on the consortium's impacts on participating institutions of higher education and the effects of creating additional work-based learning activities on students, faculty, and employers; and
- Recommendations for statutory changes, financial resources, department policy changes, and institution of higher education policy changes necessary to improve successful work-based learning opportunities for students in institutions of higher education.

Funds appropriated to the commission on higher education (commission) may be used by the commission to cover the costs of work-based learning requirements for students who are required to complete credit-bearing work-based learning requirements to graduate from an institution of higher education.

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1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1. Legislative declaration.** (1) The general assembly  
3 finds and declares that:

4 (a) Colorado has continued to improve access to high-quality  
5 work-based learning through the creation of tools like the work-based  
6 learning continuum, work-based learning quality expectations, and the  
7 talent development glossary;

1 (b) The Colorado department of higher education and the  
2 Colorado commission on higher education find that work-based learning  
3 opportunities significantly enhance a student's exposure to the workforce  
4 and empower students with the skills necessary to succeed in a rapidly  
5 evolving economy; and

6 (c) The Colorado department of higher education and the  
7 Colorado commission on higher education find that work-based learning  
8 opportunities are a critical element of postsecondary success and blur the  
9 lines between K-12 education, postsecondary education, and the  
10 workplace in all fields;

11 (2) The general assembly finds, therefore, that Colorado's learners  
12 and earners will be well-served by the expansion of work-based learning  
13 opportunities that are strategically developed, monitored, and  
14 continuously improved, and function as a part of an intentionally designed  
15 and managed effort among institutions of higher education, program  
16 design experts, workforce development and economic experts, and  
17 industry leaders, particularly industry leader employers in high-demand  
18 fields.

19 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, **add** article 82 to title

27 CONSORTIUM CONVENED PURSUANT TO SECTION 23-82-102 (2)(a).

1           (2) "DEPARTMENT" MEANS THE DEPARTMENT OF HIGHER  
2 EDUCATION CREATED AND EXISTING PURSUANT TO SECTION 24-1-114.

3           (3) "FUND" MEANS THE HIGHER EDUCATION WORK-BASED  
4 LEARNING CONSORTIUM FUND.

5           (4) "INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION" MEANS:

6           (a) A STATE INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION, AS DEFINED IN  
7 SECTION 23-18-102, OR AN ACCREDITED CAMPUS OF A STATE INSTITUTION  
8 OF HIGHER EDUCATION;

9           (b) A PARTICIPATING PRIVATE INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION,  
10 AS DEFINED IN SECTION 23-18-102;

11           (c) A LOCAL DISTRICT COLLEGE, AS DEFINED IN SECTION

13           (d) AN AREA TECHNICAL COLLEGE, AS DEFINED IN SECTION  
14 23-60-103.

15           (5) "INDUSTRY-SPONSORED PROJECTS" MEANS PROJECTS THAT  
16 CREATE A HIGH-QUALITY OPPORTUNITY FOR STUDENTS IN WHICH THE  
17 WORK-BASED LEARNING CONTENT WILL ENHANCE EDUCATIONAL  
18 LEARNING OBJECTS OF THE PROJECT AND COURSES TO WHICH THE PROJECT  
19 IS APPLIED. "INDUSTRY-SPONSORED PROJECTS" ARE A TYPE OF  
20 WORK-BASED LEARNING.

21           (6) "PILOT PROGRAM" MEANS THE WORK-BASED LEARNING  
22 CONSORTIUM PILOT PROGRAM CREATED IN SECTION 23-82-102 (1).

23           (7) "WORK-BASED LEARNING" HAS THE SAME MEANING AS SET  
24 FORTH IN SECTION 8-83-601.

25           **23-82-102. Work-based learning consortium pilot program -**  
26 **created - duties - repeal.** (1) THE WORK-BASED LEARNING CONSORTIUM  
27 PILOT PROGRAM IS CREATED IN THE DEPARTMENT. UPON RECEIVING

1 SUFFICIENT FUNDS AS DESCRIBED IN SECTION 23-82-104 (1), THE  
2 DEPARTMENT SHALL ESTABLISH, IMPLEMENT, MANAGE, AND MAINTAIN

13 (c) PROVIDE BROADER ACCESS TO COLLEGIATE WORK-BASED  
14 LEARNING FOR STUDENTS;

15 (d) MEASURE THE IMPACT OF WORK-BASED LEARNING ON  
16 PARTICIPATING STUDENTS; AND

17 (e) LEARN HOW INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION CAN  
18 INCREASE THE VALUE OF POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION THROUGH CAREER  
19 EXPOSURE AND PREPAREDNESS.

20 (3) (a) PENDING THE RECEIPT OF SUFFICIENT FUNDS, THE  
21 DEPARTMENT SHALL CONVENE A CONSORTIUM OF THE FOLLOWING  
22 REPRESENTATIVES AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SECTION:

23 (I) AT LEAST THREE REPRESENTATIVES FROM EACH PARTICIPATING  
24 INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION, WHO MAY BE PARTICIPATING  
25 FACULTY MEMBERS, LEADERS FROM A CAREER CENTER, CHIEF ACADEMIC  
26 OFFICERS, OR PROVOSTS;

27 (II) A MEMBER FROM THE COLORADO COMMISSION ON HIGHER

1 EDUCATION;

2 (III) MEMBERS OF THE COLORADO DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND

8 (b) THE CONSORTIUM SHALL MEET FOR THREE YEARS AFTER THE

9 EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SECTION.

10 (c) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL SELECT THE PARTICIPATING

11 INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (3)(a) OF

12 THIS SECTION BASED ON AVAILABLE FUNDING AND OTHER CRITERIA

13 ESTABLISHED BY THE DEPARTMENT.

14 (d) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL WORK WITH THE COLORADO

15 DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND EMPLOYMENT AND THE OFFICE OF ECONOMIC

16 DEVELOPMENT, AS RELEVANT SUBJECT MATTER EXPERTS, TO FACILITATE

17 EMPLOYER ENGAGEMENT AND TO PROMOTE INDUSTRY-SPONSORED

18 PROJECTS.

19 (e) THE MEMBERS OF THE CONSORTIUM SERVE WITHOUT

20 COMPENSATION AND WITHOUT REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES.

21 (f) SUBJECT TO AVAILABLE FUNDING, FACULTY PARTICIPANTS

22 FROM PARTICIPATING INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION MAY RECEIVE

23 A STIPEND FROM THE FUND.

24 (4) THE CONSORTIUM SHALL:

25 (a) WORK WITH EACH PARTICIPATING INSTITUTION OF HIGHER

26 EDUCATION'S FACULTY TO EMBED INDUSTRY-SPONSORED PROJECTS IN

27 COURSE CURRICULUM THAT MEET THE WORK-BASED LEARNING QUALITY

1 STANDARDS ESTABLISHED PURSUANT TO SECTION 8-83-602 (5);

2 (b) WORK WITH THE DEPARTMENT TO DETERMINE THE IMPACT OF

3 INDUSTRY-SPONSORED PROJECTS;

4 (c) WORK WITH A THIRD-PARTY PLATFORM TO CONNECT FACULTY

5 FROM PARTICIPATING INSTITUTIONS TO EMPLOYERS FOR THE PURPOSE OF

6 DEVELOPING HIGH-QUALITY PROJECT-BASED LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES

7 FOR CLASSROOM INSTRUCTION;

8 (d) ADVISE THE COLORADO COMMISSION ON HIGHER EDUCATION

9 ON STRATEGIES TO IMPROVE STUDENT ACCESS TO HIGH-QUALITY,

10 WORK-BASED LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES FOR STUDENTS BASED ON

11 PARTICIPATING FACULTY MEMBERS' EXPERIENCE EMBEDDING

12 INDUSTRY-SPONSORED PROJECTS INTO CURRICULUM;

13 (e) DEVELOP BEST PRACTICES FOR INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER

14 EDUCATION TO EXPAND ACCESS TO WORK-BASED LEARNING IN THE

15 CLASSROOM THROUGH INDUSTRY-SPONSORED PROJECTS; AND

16 (f) DEVELOP FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS BASED ON THE

17 CONSORTIUM'S DUTIES DESCRIBED IN THIS SUBSECTION (4).

18 (5) THE THIRD-PARTY PLATFORM DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (4)(c)

19 OF THIS SECTION MUST:

20 (a) WORK, AS NECESSARY, WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND

21 EMPLOYMENT, INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATIONS' CAREER SERVICES

22 AND WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT TEAMS, THE OFFICE OF ECONOMIC

- 6 (II) PARTNERING WITH EACH PARTICIPATING INSTITUTION OF
- 7 HIGHER EDUCATION'S CAREER SERVICES OR WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT
- 8 TEAM AND FACULTY AND STAFF TO DEVELOP A STRATEGY TO GROW THEIR
- 9 INDUSTRY AND EMPLOYER NETWORKS;
- 10 (III) WORKING WITH PARTICIPATING INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER

20 SOURCES FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS ARTICLE 82. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL  
21 TRANSMIT ALL MONEY RECEIVED THROUGH GIFTS, GRANTS, OR DONATIONS  
22 TO THE STATE TREASURER, WHO SHALL CREDIT THE MONEY TO THE HIGHER  
23 EDUCATION WORK-BASED LEARNING CONSORTIUM FUND CREATED IN THIS

25 (2) THE DEPARTMENT MAY ACCEPT DONATIONS OF IN-KIND

1           (3) THE HIGHER EDUCATION WORK-BASED LEARNING CONSORTIUM  
2 FUND IS CREATED IN THE STATE TREASURY. THE FUND CONSISTS OF GIFTS,  
3 GRANTS, AND DONATIONS CREDITED TO THE FUND PURSUANT TO  
4 SUBSECTION (1) OF THIS SECTION AND ANY OTHER MONEY THAT THE  
5 GENERAL ASSEMBLY MAY APPROPRIATE OR TRANSFER TO THE FUND. THE  
6 STATE TREASURER SHALL CREDIT ALL INTEREST AND INCOME DERIVED  
7 FROM THE DEPOSIT AND INVESTMENT OF MONEY IN THE FUND TO THE  
8 FUND.

9           (4) MONEY IN THE FUND IS CONTINUOUSLY APPROPRIATED TO THE  
10 DEPARTMENT FOR PURPOSES OF THIS ARTICLE 82.

11           (5) (a) IF, BY JUNE 30, 2028, THE MONEY IN THE FUND HAS NEVER  
12 REACHED OR EXCEEDED TWO MILLION DOLLARS, THE STATE TREASURER  
13 SHALL RETURN EACH GRANTOR'S OR DONOR'S GIFT, GRANT, OR DONATION.

14           (b) IF SECTION 23-82-102 TAKES EFFECT PURSUANT TO SECTION  
15 23-82-104 (1), ON THE DAY PRIOR TO THE REPEAL OF THE FUND THREE

22 TREASURER RETURNS MONEY TO DONORS OR GRANTORS AS DESCRIBED IN  
23 SUBSECTION (5)(a) OR (5)(b) OF THIS SECTION, AS APPLICABLE, THE STATE  
24 TREASURER SHALL, PRIOR TO THE REPEAL OF THE FUND, TRANSFER ALL  
25 UNEXPENDED AND UNENCUMBERED MONEY IN THE FUND TO THE GENERAL  
26 FUND.

27           **23-82-104. Effective dates - repeal of part - notice to revisor of**

1 **statutes.** (1) SECTION 23-82-102 WILL TAKE EFFECT IF THE FUND  
2 RECEIVES TWO MILLION DOLLARS IN GIFTS, GRANTS, OR DONATIONS FOR  
3 PURPOSES OF THIS ARTICLE 82. THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE  
4 DEPARTMENT OF HIGHER EDUCATION SHALL NOTIFY THE REVISOR OF  
5 STATUTES IN WRITING OF THE DATE WHEN THE CONDITION SPECIFIED IN  
6 THIS SECTION HAS OCCURRED BY EMAILING THE NOTICE TO  
7 REVISOROFSTATUTES.GA@COLEG.GOV. SECTION 23-82-102 TAKES EFFECT
