A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING THE CONTINUATION OF THE REGULATION OF

NATUROPATHIC DOCTORS BY THE DIRECTOR OF THE DIVISION OF

PROFESSIONS AND OCCUPATIONS IN THE DEPARTMENT OF

REGULATORY AGENCIES, AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH,

IMPLEMENTING THE DEPARTMENT'S SUNSET REVIEW

RECOMMENDATIONS.

Bill Summary

Sunset Process - Senate Health and Human Services

Committee. The bill implements the recommendations of the department of regulatory agencies, as contained in the department's sunset review of naturopathic doctors, as follows:

- ! Continues the regulation of naturopathic doctors by the director of the division of professions and occupations for 5 years, until September 1, 2022 (sections 1 and 2);
- ! Requires insurance carriers to report to the director any malpractice judgments against or settlements entered into by a naturopathic doctor (sections 4 and 5);
- ! Adds naturopathic doctors to the list of persons required to report child abuse or neglect (**section 7**) and mistreatment of at-risk elders and at-risk adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities (**section 6**);
- ! Clarifies that the naturopathic formulary that lists the medicines naturopathic doctors may use in the practice of naturopathic medicine includes prescription substances and devices authorized under the "Naturopathic Doctor Act" (section 3); and
- ! Corrects the name of the homeopathic pharmacopoeia as it appears in the act (section 3).

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

- 7 **declaration repeal.** (13) (a) The following agencies, functions, or both,
- 8 will repeal on September 1, 2017:
- 9 (V) The registering of naturopathic doctors by the director in accordance with article 37.3 of title 12, C.R.S.
- 11 (19) (a) The following agencies, functions, or both, will ARE SCHEDULED FOR repeal on September 1, 2020:
- 13 (XII) THE REGISTRATION OF NATUROPATHIC DOCTORS IN
 14 ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE 37.3 OF TITLE 12.

8	SECTION 3. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-37.3-102, amend
9	the introductory portion, (7), and (11) as follows:

11	unless the context otherwise requires:
12	(7) "Homeopathic preparations" means medicines prepared
13	according to the most current version of the "Homeopathic
14	Pharmacopoeia of the United States/revised services REVISION SERVICE".
15	(11) "Naturopathic formulary" means the list of nonprescription
16	classes of medicines determined by the director that naturopathic doctors
17	use in the practice of naturopathic medicine. "NATUROPATHIC
18	FORMULARY" INCLUDES ANY PRESCRIPTION SUBSTANCE OR DEVICE THAT
19	IS AUTHORIZED UNDER THIS ARTICLE 37.3.
20	SECTION 4. In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 12-37.3-114.5
21	as follows:
22	12-37.3-114.5. Judgments and settlements - reporting. IN
23	ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 10-1-125.5, A NATUROPATHIC DOCTOR'S
24	MALPRACTICE INSURANCE CARRIER SHALL REPORT TO THE DIRECTOR
25	INFORMATION RELATING TO A FINAL JUDGMENT OR SETTLEMENT AGAINST
26	THE NATUROPATHIC DOCTOR FOR MALPRACTICE. THE DIRECTOR SHALL
27	REVIEW THE INFORMATION AND INVESTIGATE AND, AS APPROPRIATE, TAKE

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1	DISCIPLINARY OR OTHER ACTION AGAINST THE NATUROPATHIC DOCTOR.
2	SECTION 5. In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 10-1-125.5 as
3	follows:
4	10-1-125.5. Reporting of malpractice claims against
5	naturopathic doctors. Each insurance company licensed to do
6	BUSINESS IN THIS STATE AND ENGAGED IN WRITING MALPRACTICE
7	INSURANCE FOR NATUROPATHIC DOCTORS REGISTERED UNDER ARTICLE
8	37.3 OF TITLE 12 SHALL SEND TO THE DIRECTOR OF THE DIVISION OF
9	PROFESSIONS AND OCCUPATIONS IN THE DEPARTMENT OF REGULATORY
10	AGENCIES, IN THE FORM PRESCRIBED BY THE COMMISSIONER,
11	INFORMATION RELATING TO EACH MALPRACTICE CLAIM AGAINST A
12	REGISTERED NATUROPATHIC DOCTOR THAT IS SETTLED OR IN WHICH
13	JUDGMENT IS RENDERED AGAINST THE INSURED NATUROPATHIC DOCTOR.
14	THE INSURANCE COMPANY SHALL INCLUDE ANY INFORMATION THE
15	DIRECTOR DETERMINES NECESSARY TO ENABLE THE DIRECTOR TO
16	CONDUCT A FURTHER INVESTIGATION AND HEARING.
17	SECTION 6. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 18-6.5-108, amend
18	(1)(b) introductory portion and (1)(b)(I) as follows:
19	18-6.5-108. Mandatory reports of mistreatment of at-risk
20	elders and at-risk adults with IDD - list of reporters - penalties.
21	(1) (b) The following persons, whether paid or unpaid, shall report as
22	required by paragraph (a) of this subsection (1) SUBSECTION (1)(a) OF
23	THIS SECTION:
24	(I) Any person providing health care or health-care-related
25	services, including general medical, surgical, or nursing services;
26	medical, surgical, or nursing speciality services; dental services; vision
27	services; pharmacy services; chiropractic services; NATUROPATHIC

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1	MEDICINE SERVICES; or physical, occupational, musical, or other
2	therapies;
3	SECTION 7. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 19-3-304, amend
4	(2)(jj) and (2)(kk); and add (2)(ll) as follows:

6	(2) Persons required to report such abuse or neglect or circumstances or
7	conditions include any:
8	(jj) Person who is registered as a psychologist candidate pursuant
9	to section 12-43-304 (7), C.R.S., marriage and family therapist candidate
10	pursuant to section 12-43-504 (5), C.R.S., or licensed professional
11	counselor candidate pursuant to section 12-43-603 (5), C.R.S., or who is
12	described in section 12-43-215; C.R.S.; and
13	(kk) Emergency medical service providers, as defined in sections
14	25-3.5-103 (8) and 25-3.5-103 (12) C.R.S., and certified pursuant to part
15	2 of article 3.5 of title 25; C.R.S. AND
16	(ll) Naturopathic doctor registered under article 37.3 of
17	TITLE 12.
18	SECTION 8. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
19	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
20	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August
21	9, 2017, if adjournment sine die is on May 10, 2017); except that, if a
22	referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the
23	state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act
24	within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect
25	unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
26	November 2018 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
27	official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

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
