Current Appropriations Clause in Bill

The bill includes an appropriation clause that provides a total of \$951,528 General Fund in FY 2021-22 as follows:

• \$225,560 to the Office of the Governor, based on the assumption the Office will JBC Staff Fiscal Analysis 1

- require an additional 1.8 FTE;
- \$170,528 to the Governor's Office of Information Technology, based on the assumption that the Office will require an additional 1.8 FTE;
- \$191,412 to the Office of the Governor for the purchase of legal services, which amount is reappropriated to the Department of Law and is based on the assumption that the Department of Law will require an additional 1.0 FTE;
- \$267,161 to the Department of Human Services, based on the assumption that the Department will require an additional 1.2 FTE; and
- \$96,867 to the Department of Education, based on the assumption the that Department will require an additional 0.9 FTE.

Points to Consider

General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2021-22 based on the March 2021 Legislative Council Staff revenue forecast. The budget package includes a set aside of \$48.0 million General Fund for bills that require General Fund appropriations for FY 2021-22. This bill requires a General Fund appropriation of \$951,528 for FY 2021-22, reducing the \$48.0 million set aside by the same amount.
