A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 **CONCERNING THE PROMOTION OF AN ACCURATE COUNT IN THE**
102 **DECENNIAL CENSUS BY CREATING A CENSUS OUTREACH**
103 **PROGRAM.**

Bill Summary

In the division of local government (division) the bill creates the 2020 census outreach grant program (grant program) in the department of local affairs (department) to provide grants to local governments, intergovernmental agencies, councils of government, housing authorities, school districts, and nonprofit organizations (eligible recipients) to

support the accurate counting of the population of the state for the 2020 census.

The department, in coordination with the grant program committee (committee), which is also created in the division, is required to implement and administer the grant program and to develop policies and procedures necessary for such implementation and administration.

The committee is created in the division to make recommendations to the department regarding the policies and procedures to review grant applications and to make recommendations to the department regarding which applications to approve for the grant award. The committee consists of 7 members, 3 of whom are appointed by the governor and 4 of whom are appointed, one each, by the speaker of the house of representatives, the president of the senate, and the minority leaders of the house of representatives and the senate.

The bill specifies that eligible recipients may use grant money to conduct 2020 census outreach, promotion, and education to focus on hard-to-count communities in the state and to increase the self-response rate and accuracy of the 2020 census. Eligible recipients may also use grant money to further award grants to other local governments, intergovernmental agencies, councils of government, housing authorities, school districts, or nonprofit organizations.

To receive a grant, an eligible recipient must submit an application to the department in accordance with the policies and procedures developed by the department. The bill specifies the information that an application must include at a minimum.

The committee is required to review the applications received and to make recommendations to the department regarding which grant applications to approve. In developing its recommendations, the committee is required to consider whether the eligible recipient will be conducting outreach in hard-to-count communities and the size and geographic and demographic diversity of the hard-to-count communities in which outreach, education, and promotion of the 2020 census will occur as provided by all eligible recipients that receive grant money.

Subject to available appropriations and in accordance with the recommendation of the committee, the department is required to award grants for the purposes of the grant program on or before November 1, 2019, and to distribute the grant money to eligible recipients that were awarded grants within 30 days after the grants are awarded.

Each eligible recipient that received a grant through the grant program is required to submit a report to the department including information to be determined by the department. The department is required to submit a report to the local government committees of the senate and the house of representatives, or any successor committees, and to the governor regarding the census outreach conducted through the grant program.

For the 2019-20 fiscal year, the bill directs the general assembly to appropriate \$12 million to the department to award grants to eligible recipients for the purposes of the grant program. In addition, the department may solicit, accept, and expend gifts, grants, or donations from private or public sources for the purposes of the grant program.

On or before May 1, 2026, and on or before May 1 every 10 years thereafter, the department and the office of the governor are required to develop a strategic action plan, including a discussion of necessary funding for the plan, for outreach and promotion for a successful count of the population in Colorado during the upcoming decennial census.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** The short title of this act is the "Every Person
3 Counts In Colorado Act".

4 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, **add** 24-32-125 and
5 24-32-126 as follows:

6 **24-32-125. Census outreach grant program - creation -**
7 **committee - legislative declaration - definitions - repeal.**

8 **(1) Legislative declaration.** (a) THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS AND
9 DECLARES THAT:

10 (I) THE DECENTNIAL CENSUS OF THE POPULATION, THE ACTUAL
11 ENUMERATION OF THE NUMBER OF PERSONS LIVING IN THE UNITED STATES
12 AND ALL UNITED STATES TERRITORIES, IS REQUIRED BY THE UNITED
13 STATES CONSTITUTION;

14 (II) A PRECISE COUNT IS VITAL TO GUARANTEEING EACH STATE
15 RECEIVES THE APPROPRIATE NUMBER OF SEATS IN THE UNITED STATES
16 HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, INFLUENCES HOW STATES DRAW THEIR
17 LEGISLATIVE DISTRICTS, ENSURES COMMUNITIES ACROSS THE COUNTRY
18 RECEIVE PROPER FUNDING FOR A VARIETY OF IMPORTANT SERVICES ON
19 WHICH INDIVIDUALS, FAMILIES, AND LOCAL ECONOMIES RELY, AND
20 PROVIDES SOCIAL, DEMOGRAPHIC, AND ECONOMIC PROFILES OF THE

1 NATION'S PEOPLE TO GUIDE POLICY DECISIONS AT EACH LEVEL OF
2 GOVERNMENT;

3 (III) OF THE APPROXIMATELY EIGHT HUNDRED EIGHTY-THREE
4 BILLION DOLLARS DISTRIBUTED THROUGH FEDERAL PROGRAMS BASED ON
5 CENSUS DATA IN THE 2016 FEDERAL FISCAL YEAR, COLORADO RECEIVED
6 MORE THAN THIRTEEN BILLION DOLLARS THROUGH FEDERAL GRANTS AND
7 DIRECT PAYMENTS FOR PROGRAMS THAT PROVIDE COLORADANS WITH
8 HEALTH CARE, EDUCATION, TRANSPORTATION, NUTRITION, CHILD CARE,
9 HOUSING, ENERGY ASSISTANCE, AND MANY OTHER SERVICES;

10 (IV) THE MANY SIGNIFICANT HURDLES EXPERIENCED BY THE 2020
11 CENSUS, INCLUDING INSUFFICIENT FUNDING, ESPECIALLY FOR OUTREACH
12 IN HARD-TO-COUNT COMMUNITIES AND POPULATIONS THAT HAVE BEEN
13 HISTORICALLY UNDERCOUNTED BY PREVIOUS DECENTNIAL CENSUSES, HAS
14 RAISED SIGNIFICANT CONCERN ABOUT AN UNDERCOUNT OF THE
15 COLORADO POPULATION IN THE 2020 CENSUS;

16 (V) DURING THE 2010 CENSUS, EVEN WITH THE ADDITIONAL
17 OUTREACH RESOURCES AVAILABLE IN COMPARISON TO THOSE AVAILABLE
18 FOR THE 2020 CENSUS, IN COLORADO CHILDREN UNDER THE AGE OF FIVE
19 WERE UNDERCOUNTED BY EIGHTEEN THOUSAND AND LATINO CHILDREN
20 UNDER THE AGE OF FIVE WERE UNDERCOUNTED BY EIGHT THOUSAND; AND

21 (VI) UNDERCOUNTING THE POPULATION OF COLORADO AND ITS
22 LOCAL JURISDICTIONS JEOPARDIZES FUNDING FROM SEVERAL FEDERAL
23 ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS THAT ALLOCATE FUNDS ON THE BASIS OF
24 DECENTNIAL CENSUS-DERIVED STATISTICS AND JEOPARDIZES THE
25 LIKELIHOOD OF THE STATE GAINING A CONGRESSIONAL SEAT DURING
26 CONGRESSIONAL REAPPORTIONMENT IN CONTRAST TO STATES THAT MAKE
27 A SIGNIFICANT INVESTMENT IN A COMPLETE COUNT.

1 (b) THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FURTHER FINDS AND DECLares THAT:

2 (I) THE FUTURE PROSPERITY AND WELL-BEING OF THE STATE
3 DEPEND ON THE QUALITY OF THE INFORMATION COLLECTED BY THE
4 CENSUS BUREAU ABOUT OUR POPULATION AND INFRASTRUCTURE. CENSUS
5 DATA GUIDES A WIDE RANGE OF DECISIONS MADE IN THE PUBLIC AND
6 PRIVATE SECTORS THAT AFFECT THE LIVES OF ALL COLORADANS; AND

7 (II) BASED ON A REPORT BY THE COLORADO FISCAL INSTITUTE
8 THAT CALCULATED THE MONEY NECESSARY TO CONDUCT OUTREACH TO
9 THE ONE MILLION FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND HARD-TO-COUNT
10 INDIVIDUALS IN THE STATE, A TWELVE MILLION DOLLAR INVESTMENT IN A
11 GRANT PROGRAM WOULD ALLOW THE STATE TO ALLOCATE RESOURCES,
12 THROUGH GRANTS TO LOCAL GOVERNMENTS, INTERGOVERNMENTAL
13 AGENCIES, COUNCILS OF GOVERNMENT, AND NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS,
14 TO HARD-TO-COUNT COMMUNITIES IN COLORADO TO INCREASE THE
15 RESPONSE RATE AND ACCURACY OF THE 2020 CENSUS IN COLORADO.

18 (a) "2020 CENSUS" MEANS THE DECAENNAL CENSUS CONDUCTED BY
19 THE FEDERAL UNITED STATES CENSUS BUREAU IN 2020 TO DETERMINE THE
20 NUMBER OF PEOPLE LIVING IN THE UNITED STATES.

21 (b) "COMMITTEE" MEANS THE 2020 CENSUS OUTREACH GRANT
22 PROGRAM COMMITTEE CREATED IN SUBSECTION (5) OF THIS SECTION.

23 (c) "DEPARTMENT" MEANS THE DEPARTMENT OF LOCAL AFFAIRS.

24 (d) "DIVISION" MEANS THE DIVISION OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT
25 CREATED IN THE DEPARTMENT.

26 (e) "ELIGIBLE RECIPIENT" MEANS AN ENTITY THAT IS ELIGIBLE TO
27 RECEIVE A GRANT THROUGH THE GRANT PROGRAM AND INCLUDES LOCAL

1 GOVERNMENTS, INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES, COUNCILS OF
2 GOVERNMENT, HOUSING AUTHORITIES, SCHOOL DISTRICTS, ■ NONPROFIT
3 ORGANIZATIONS, THE SOUTHERN UTE INDIAN TRIBE, AND THE UTE
4 MOUNTAIN UTE TRIBE.

5 (f) "GRANT PROGRAM" MEANS THE 2020 CENSUS OUTREACH
6 GRANT PROGRAM CREATED IN SUBSECTION (3) OF THIS SECTION.

7 (g) "HARD-TO-COUNT COMMUNITIES" MEANS COMMUNITIES AND
8 POPULATIONS THAT HAVE BEEN HISTORICALLY UNDERCOUNTED BY
9 PREVIOUS DECENTNIAL CENSUSES, INCLUDING, BUT NOT NECESSARILY
10 LIMITED TO, CHILDREN UNDER FIVE YEARS, RACIAL AND ETHNIC
11 MINORITIES, COMMUNITIES OF COLOR, AMERICAN INDIANS AND ALASKAN
12 NATIVES, PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES, PEOPLE WITH LOW INCOMES,
13 IMMIGRANTS, PEOPLE WHO SPEAK AND UNDERSTAND LIMITED AMOUNTS
14 OF ENGLISH, PEOPLE LIVING IN RURAL AREAS OF THE STATE, PEOPLE IN THE
15 STATE WITHOUT SUFFICIENT INTERNET ACCESS, ADULTS AGE SIXTY OR
16 OVER, AND PEOPLE WHO ARE TRANSIENT OR HOMELESS.

17 (h) "NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION" MEANS A TAX-EXEMPT
18 CHARITABLE OR SOCIAL WELFARE ORGANIZATION OPERATING UNDER
19 SECTION 501 (c)(3) OR 501 (c)(4) OF TITLE 26 OF THE UNITED STATES
20 CODE, THE FEDERAL "INTERNAL REVENUE CODE OF 1986", AS AMENDED.

21 **(3) 2020 census outreach grant program creation.** (a) THERE
22 IS HEREBY CREATED IN THE DIVISION THE 2020 CENSUS OUTREACH GRANT
23 PROGRAM TO PROVIDE GRANTS TO ELIGIBLE RECIPIENTS TO SUPPORT THE
24 ACCURATE COUNTING OF THE POPULATION OF THE STATE FOR THE 2020
25 CENSUS.

26 (b) THE DEPARTMENT, IN COORDINATION WITH THE COMMITTEE,
27 SHALL IMPLEMENT AND ADMINISTER THE GRANT PROGRAM AND SHALL

1 AWARD GRANTS AS PROVIDED IN THIS SECTION, SUBJECT TO AVAILABLE
2 APPROPRIATIONS. GRANTS SHALL BE PAID FROM MONEY APPROPRIATED TO
3 THE DEPARTMENT FOR THE GRANT PROGRAM AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION
4 (8)(a) OF THIS SECTION AND FROM ANY GIFTS, GRANTS, OR DONATIONS
5 RECEIVED BY THE DEPARTMENT FOR THE PURPOSES OF THE GRANT
6 PROGRAM PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (8)(b) OF THIS SECTION.

7 (c) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL DEVELOP POLICIES AND PROCEDURES
8 TO IMPLEMENT AND ADMINISTER THE GRANT PROGRAM. AT A MINIMUM,
9 THE POLICIES MUST SPECIFY THE TIME FRAMES FOR APPLYING FOR GRANTS,
10 THE FORM OF THE GRANT PROGRAM APPLICATION, AND THE CONTENTS OF
11 THE REPORT REQUIRED BY ELIGIBLE RECIPIENTS THAT RECEIVED GRANT
12 MONEY PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (7)(a) OF THIS SECTION.

13 (d) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL IMPLEMENT AND ADMINISTER THE
14 GRANT PROGRAM WITHIN ITS EXISTING RESOURCES.

15 (4) **Purposes for which grant money may be used.** ELIGIBLE
16 RECIPIENTS MAY USE THE MONEY RECEIVED THROUGH THE GRANT
17 PROGRAM FOR THE FOLLOWING PURPOSES:

18 (a) TO CONDUCT 2020 CENSUS OUTREACH, EDUCATION, AND
19 PROMOTION TO FOCUS ON HARD-TO-COUNT COMMUNITIES IN THE STATE
20 AND TO INCREASE THE SELF-RESPONSE RATE AND ACCURACY OF THE 2020
21 CENSUS IN THE STATE; OR

22 (b) TO FURTHER AWARD GRANT MONEY TO OTHER LOCAL
23 GOVERNMENTS, INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES, COUNCILS OF
24 GOVERNMENT, HOUSING AUTHORITIES, SCHOOL DISTRICTS, OR NONPROFIT
25 ORGANIZATIONS, SO LONG AS THE GRANT MONEY WILL BE USED FOR THE
26 PURPOSES SPECIFIED IN SUBSECTION (4)(a) OF THIS SECTION.

27 (5) **2020 census outreach grant program committee.** (a) THE

1 2020 CENSUS OUTREACH GRANT PROGRAM COMMITTEE IS CREATED IN THE
2 DEPARTMENT TO MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE DEPARTMENT
3 REGARDING THE POLICIES AND PROCEDURES DEVELOPED PURSUANT TO
4 SUBSECTION (3)(c) OF THIS SECTION, TO REVIEW GRANT APPLICATIONS,
5 AND TO MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE
6 DEPARTMENT REGARDING WHICH APPLICATIONS TO APPROVE FOR A GRANT
7 AWARD. THE COMMITTEE CONSISTS OF SEVEN MEMBERS WHO SHALL BE
8 APPOINTED BY JUNE 1, 2019, AS FOLLOWS:

9 (I) THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, THE
10 PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE, AND THE MINORITY LEADERS OF THE HOUSE OF
11 REPRESENTATIVES AND THE SENATE SHALL EACH APPOINT ONE COMMITTEE
12 MEMBER WHO IS NOT A MEMBER OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY; AND

13 (II) THE GOVERNOR SHALL APPOINT THREE COMMITTEE MEMBERS.

14 (b) IN MAKING APPOINTMENTS TO THE COMMITTEE, THE ELECTED
15 OFFICIALS MAKING THE APPOINTMENTS SHALL ATTEMPT TO APPOINT
16 COMMITTEE MEMBERS THAT REFLECT THE GEOGRAPHIC AND
17 DEMOGRAPHIC DIVERSITY OF THE STATE AND SHALL ATTEMPT TO INCLUDE
18 MEMBERS OF DIVERSE POLITICAL, RACIAL, CULTURAL, INCOME, AND
19 ABILITY GROUPS. IN ADDITION, THE ELECTED OFFICIALS MAKING THE
20 APPOINTMENTS SHALL ENSURE THAT HIS OR HER APPOINTEE OR
21 APPOINTEES HAVE NOT, WITHIN THE LAST FIVE YEARS, WORKED FOR OR
22 SERVED ON THE BOARD OF ANY ELIGIBLE RECIPIENT THAT WILL LIKELY
23 APPLY FOR A GRANT THROUGH THE GRANT PROGRAM. ANY ELIGIBLE
24 RECIPIENT FOR WHICH A COMMITTEE MEMBER HAS WORKED OR SERVED ON
25 THE BOARD IN THE LAST FIVE YEARS IS DISQUALIFIED FROM APPLYING FOR
26 A GRANT THROUGH THE GRANT PROGRAM.

27 (c) IF FOR ANY REASON THERE IS A VACANCY ON THE COMMITTEE

1 AFTER JUNE 15, 2019, THE GOVERNOR SHALL FILL THE VACANCY AS SOON
2 AS POSSIBLE.

3 (d) THE GOVERNOR SHALL SELECT ONE PERSON TO SERVE AS THE
4 CHAIR OF THE COMMITTEE.

5 (e) THE COMMITTEE SHALL HOLD ITS FIRST MEETING NO LATER
6 THAN JULY 1, 2019.

7 (f) MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE SHALL NOT RECEIVE
8 COMPENSATION; EXCEPT THAT THE MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE WHO
9 RESIDE MORE THAN FIFTY MILES FROM THE LOCATION OF A COMMITTEE
10 HEARING ARE ENTITLED TO RECEIVE THE SAME PER DIEM COMPENSATION
11 AND REIMBURSEMENT OF EXPENSES AS THOSE PROVIDED FOR MEMBERS OF
12 BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS PURSUANT TO SECTION 24-34-102 (13) AND
13 FOR EXPENSES INCURRED IN TRAVELING TO AND FROM THE MEETINGS OF
14 THE COMMITTEE, INCLUDING ANY REQUIRED DEPENDENT OR ATTENDANT
15 TRAVEL, FOOD, AND LODGING. MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE ARE ALSO
16 ENTITLED TO BE REIMBURSED FOR ANY EXPENSES RELATED TO DEPENDENT
17 OR ATTENDANT CARE NECESSARY TO SUPPORT THEIR PARTICIPATION IN A
18 COMMITTEE HEARING.

19 (g) THE CHAIR OF THE COMMITTEE SHALL ENSURE THAT AT EVERY
20 MEETING OF THE COMMITTEE THERE IS AN OPPORTUNITY FOR PUBLIC
21 COMMENT, INCLUDING PUBLIC COMMENTS SUBMITTED VIA THE INTERNET.
22 THE CHAIR OF THE COMMITTEE SHALL SOLICIT INPUT ONLINE OR IN PERSON
23 AT COMMITTEE MEETINGS BEFORE AND DURING THE PROCESS THROUGH
24 WHICH THE COMMITTEE MAKES RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE DEPARTMENT
25 REGARDING GRANT RECIPIENTS.

26 (h) ON OR BEFORE AUGUST 15, 2019, THE COMMITTEE SHALL
27 NOTIFY THE PUBLIC OF THE GRANT PROGRAM.

6 (I) A DESCRIPTION OF HOW THE ELIGIBLE RECIPIENT'S CURRENT
7 CAPACITY FOR OUTREACH AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT ENABLES IT TO
8 INCREASE THE SELF-RESPONSE RATE AND ACCURACY OF THE 2020 CENSUS
9 IN THE STATE, SPECIFICALLY IN HARD-TO-COUNT COMMUNITIES,
10 INCLUDING OUTREACH, EDUCATION, AND PROMOTION EFFORTS;

11 (II) A DESCRIPTION OF HOW THE ELIGIBLE RECIPIENT PLANS TO USE
12 GRANT MONEY TO INCREASE THE RESPONSE RATE AND ACCURACY OF THE
13 2020 CENSUS IN THE STATE;

14 (III) THE WAYS IN WHICH THE ELIGIBLE RECIPIENT WILL USE GRANT
15 MONEY TO IMPROVE SELF-RESPONSE RATES IN THE 2020 CENSUS IN
16 HARD-TO-COUNT COMMUNITIES IN THE STATE; AND

17 (IV) WHETHER THE ELIGIBLE RECIPIENT PLANS TO USE GRANT
18 MONEY TO FURTHER GRANT AWARDS TO OTHER ENTITIES, AND, IF
19 APPLICABLE, THE NATURE OF THE WORK OF THOSE ENTITIES AND THE
20 AMOUNT OF THE GRANT MONEY THE ELIGIBLE RECIPIENT INTENDS TO
21 RETAIN TO COVER ITS ADMINISTRATIVE COSTS.

22 (b) THE COMMITTEE SHALL REVIEW THE APPLICATIONS RECEIVED
23 PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION AND SHALL MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE
24 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT REGARDING WHICH GRANT
25 APPLICATIONS TO APPROVE. THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE
26 DEPARTMENT SHALL HAVE SOLE DISCRETION IN MAKING THE GRANT
27 AWARDS. IN DEVELOPING ITS RECOMMENDATIONS THE COMMITTEE SHALL

1 CONSIDER:

2 (I) WHETHER THE ELIGIBLE RECIPIENT WILL BE CONDUCTING
3 OUTREACH IN HARD-TO-COUNT COMMUNITIES IN THE STATE; AND

4 (II) THE SIZE AND GEOGRAPHIC AND DEMOGRAPHIC DIVERSITY OF
5 THE HARD-TO-COUNT COMMUNITIES IN THE STATE IN WHICH OUTREACH,
6 EDUCATION, AND PROMOTION OF THE 2020 CENSUS WILL OCCUR AS
7 PROVIDED BY ALL ELIGIBLE RECIPIENTS THAT RECEIVE GRANT MONEY.

8 (c) SUBJECT TO AVAILABLE APPROPRIATIONS, THE EXECUTIVE
9 DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT SHALL AWARD GRANTS FOR THE PURPOSES
10 SPECIFIED IN THIS SECTION ON OR BEFORE NOVEMBER 1, 2019. THE
11 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT SHALL DISTRIBUTE THE GRANT
12 MONEY TO ELIGIBLE RECIPIENTS THAT WERE AWARDED GRANTS WITHIN
13 THIRTY DAYS AFTER THE GRANTS ARE AWARDED.

14 (d) ANY ELIGIBLE RECIPIENT THAT IS AWARDED A GRANT
15 PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION SHALL NOTIFY THE COUNTY IN WHICH THE
16 ELIGIBLE RECIPIENT IS SITUATED OF THE GRANT AWARD.

17 **(7) Reporting requirements.** (a) ON OR BEFORE MAY 1, 2021,
18 EACH ELIGIBLE RECIPIENT THAT RECEIVED A GRANT THROUGH THE GRANT
19 PROGRAM SHALL SUBMIT A REPORT AND SUPPORTING DOCUMENTATION OF
20 ELIGIBLE EXPENDITURES TO THE DEPARTMENT INCLUDING INFORMATION
21 TO BE DETERMINED BY THE DIRECTOR OF THE DIVISION PURSUANT TO THE
22 POLICIES AND PROCEDURES DEVELOPED PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (3)(c)
23 OF THIS SECTION. IF AN ELIGIBLE RECIPIENT USED GRANT MONEY TO MAKE
24 GRANTS TO OTHER ENTITIES, THE ELIGIBLE RECIPIENT SHALL INCLUDE IN
25 THE REPORT THE AMOUNT OF GRANT MONEY IT USED FOR ITS
26 ADMINISTRATIVE COSTS IN MAKING ADDITIONAL GRANTS.

27 (b) ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 1, 2023, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL

1 SUBMIT A REPORT TO THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT COMMITTEES OF THE
2 SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, OR ANY SUCCESSOR
3 COMMITTEES, AND TO THE GOVERNOR REGARDING THE 2020 CENSUS
4 OUTREACH, EDUCATION, AND PROMOTION CONDUCTED THROUGH THE
5 GRANT PROGRAM. AT A MINIMUM THE REPORT MUST INCLUDE:

6 (I) A LIST OF ELIGIBLE RECIPIENTS THAT RECEIVED GRANTS AND

8 (II) THE POPULATION ON WHICH EACH ELIGIBLE RECIPIENT THAT
9 RECEIVED A GRANT FOCUSED ITS 2020 CENSUS OUTREACH USING GRANT
10 MONEY;

11 (III) COLORADO'S SELF-RESPONSE RATE IN THE 2020 CENSUS;

12 (IV) LESSONS LEARNED FROM 2020 CENSUS OUTREACH; AND

13 (V) A RECOMMENDED TIME LINE FOR THE STATE'S INVOLVEMENT
14 IN THE 2030 CENSUS OUTREACH.

15 (8) **Sources of grant money.** (a) FOR THE 2019-20 FISCAL YEAR,
16 THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY SHALL APPROPRIATE TWELVE MILLION DOLLARS
17 TO THE DEPARTMENT TO AWARD GRANTS TO ELIGIBLE RECIPIENTS FOR THE
18 PURPOSES OF THE GRANT PROGRAM SPECIFIED IN THIS SECTION. ANY
19 UNEXPENDED AND UNENCUMBERED MONEY FROM THE APPROPRIATION
20 REMAINS AVAILABLE FOR EXPENDITURE BY THE DEPARTMENT FOR THE
21 PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION IN THE NEXT FISCAL YEAR WITHOUT FURTHER
22 APPROPRIATION.

23 (b) THE DEPARTMENT MAY SOLICIT, ACCEPT, AND EXPEND GIFTS,
24 GRANTS, OR DONATIONS FROM PRIVATE OR PUBLIC SOURCES FOR THE
25 PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION.

26 (9) **Repeal.** THIS SECTION IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2022.

1 **census.** ON OR BEFORE MAY 1, 2026, AND ON OR BEFORE MAY 1 EVERY
2 TEN YEARS THEREAFTER, THE DEPARTMENT AND THE OFFICE OF THE
3 GOVERNOR SHALL DEVELOP A STRATEGIC ACTION PLAN, INCLUDING A
4 DISCUSSION OF NECESSARY FUNDING FOR THE PLAN, FOR OUTREACH,

7 **SECTION 3. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,
