Summary of Legislation

Under current law, certain voluntary contribution programs appearing on state income tax returns are subject to sunset provisions requiring that the General Assembly repeal and reenact. This bill permits these options to continue appearing on Colorado tax returns, unless contributions for a program fall below \$50,000 annually.

The affected voluntary contribution programs include the American Red Cross of Colorado, Habitat for Humanity, Special Olympics, and the pet overpopulation fund.

Assessment of No Fiscal Impact

The bill maintains current law indefinitely without substantive changes to any program or governmental function. The bill does not change the revenue, expenditures, or workload of any state agency or local government and is assessed as having no fiscal impact.

Effective Date

The bill was signed into law by the Governor on July 7, 2020, and it took effect on September 14, 2020.
