### **Current Appropriations Clause in Bill**

The bill requires but does not contain an appropriation clause.

#### **Description of Amendments in This Packet**

**J.001** Staff has prepared amendment **J.001** (attached) to add a provision appropriating a total of \$74,811 General Fund for FY 2021-22, including \$50,375 to the Department of Public Safety and \$24,436 to the Judicial Department. This provision also states that the appropriation is based on the assumption that the Judicial Department will require an additional 0.3 FTE.

## **Points to Consider**

# General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2021-22 based on the March 2021 Legislative Council Staff revenue forecast. The budget package includes a set aside of \$48.0 million General Fund for bills that require General Fund appropriations for FY 2021-22. This bill requires a General Fund appropriation of \$74,811 for FY 2021-22, reducing the \$48.0 million set aside by the same amount.
