

HB 25B-1011: HEALTH PROVIDERS PRACTICE SCOPE PREVENTIVE CARE

Fiscal note status: The fiscal note reflects the introduced bill. This bill was postponed indefinitely by the House Health and Human Services Committee on August 21, 2025; therefore, the impacts identified in this analysis do not take effect.

Summary Information

Overview. The bill would have authorized licensed health care providers to provide preventative health care services that were within their existing scope of practice and training.

Types of impacts. The bill was projected to affect the following areas on an ongoing basis:

Summary of Legislation

The bill authorizes licensed health care providers, including pharmacists, dental hygienists, and registered nurses, to provide preventive health care services that are within their scope of practice and training. The services may include administering federally approved vaccines, conducting routine health screenings, and providing preventative patient education and counseling. The bill does not expand scope of practice beyond professional licensure laws and does not require additional licensure.

State Expenditures

Workload will increase for the Department of Regulatory Agencies to provide guidance and outreach to health care providers. This workload is minimal and can be accomplished within existing resources. The fiscal note assumes that any impacts to state insurance programs from expanded preventative care authorization are minimal, as preventative services may already be provided within a provider's existing scope of practice.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.
