Points to Consider

Future Fiscal Impact

The bill extends the authority of the Electronic Recording Technology Board (ERTB) enterprise to collect electronic filing surcharges from FY 2025-26 to the end of FY 2028-29, which are not subject to the state's revenue limit under TABOR. The \$3.1 million in annual revenue and expenditures in FY 2026-27 and beyond, as noted in the Fiscal Note, are reflective of a

continuation level of spending due to the sunset date for this program being extended through FY 2028-29.
