101 **CONCERNING MEDICAID REIMBURSEMENT FOR COMMUNITY HEALTH**

credentialing requirements.

The bill eliminates reimbursement for community health workers under the Colorado medical assistance program.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 25-20.5-112, **amend** (2); and **repeal** (3) as follows:

25-20.5-112. Voluntary competency-based community health worker registry - requirements - rules - definition. (2) A community health worker must complete a state-approved training program that meets credentialing requirements based on competency statements that represent generalist entry-level core competencies for unlicensed community health workers and ~~must~~ MAY be listed on the department's voluntary competency-based community health worker registry. ~~in order to be reimbursed through the state medical assistance program for providing community health worker covered services to a medicaid member.~~

(3) ~~Participation in the voluntary competency-based community health worker registry is not required for community health workers who do not seek reimbursement through medicaid.~~

SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, **repeal** 25.5-5-334.

SECTION 3. Appropriation - adjustments to 2025 long bill. (1) To implement this act, general fund appropriations made in the annual general appropriation act for the 2025-26 state fiscal year to the department of health care policy and financing and the related FTE are decreased as follows:

9 C.R.S., is decreased by \$685,499.

15 **SECTION 4. Safety clause.** The general assembly finds,
16 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
17 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety or for appropriations for
18 the support and maintenance of the departments of the state and state
19 institutions.
