Fiscal Note Status

Points to Consider

Related Budget Information

The FY 2025-26 Long Bill reduces the program's General Fund appropriation by \$22,500 and increases the program's cash fund appropriation by \$22,500. This adjustment assumed \$22,500 in new license fee revenue that was scheduled to begin in FY 2025-26.

This bill amends the licensure requirement for gamete agencies, gamete banks, and fertility clinics to every 5 years instead of every year. While the Department has indicated that it is able to absorb this revenue decrease, it will mean that in most years, there will not be enough revenue to support the program's annual \$22,500 cash fund appropriation.
