CONCERNING AN EXTENSION OF THE REPEAL OF THE STATE SUBSTANCE

102 ABUSE TREND AND RESPONSE TASK FORCE.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The state substance abuse trend and response task force is scheduled to be repealed effective July 1, 2018. The bill extends the repeal for 10 years to September 1, 2028.
