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A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING THE PERMISSIBLE REGULATION OF DOGS IN COMMON INTEREST COMMUNITIES.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. In the law governing common interest communities, the bill invalidates any covenant that prohibits the keeping of certain types of dogs based solely on a breed, weight, or size classification. Other regulations, such as the prevention of nuisance barking and requirements concerning the number of dogs per household and the disposal of waste, remain valid.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 38-33.3-106.5, add 3 (1)(k) as follows: 4 38-33.3-106.5. Prohibitions contrary to public policy -5 patriotic and political expression - emergency vehicles - fire 6 prevention - renewable energy generation devices - affordable 7 housing - drought prevention measures - dogs - definitions. 8 (1) Notwithstanding any provision in the declaration, bylaws, or rules 9 and regulations of the association to the contrary, an association shall not 10 prohibit any of the following: 11 (k) THE KEEPING OF CERTAIN TYPES OF DOGS BASED SOLELY ON A 12 BREED, WEIGHT, OR SIZE CLASSIFICATION. AN ASSOCIATION MAY 13 REGULATE THE NUMBER OF DOGS PER HOUSEHOLD AND MAY ENFORCE 14 COVENANTS CONCERNING DOG OR OWNER BEHAVIOR, INCLUDING 15 NUISANCE BARKING, WASTE DISPOSAL, AND OTHER MATTERS. 16 **SECTION 2.** Act subject to petition - effective date. This act 17 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the 18 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August 19 8, 2018, if adjournment sine die is on May 9, 2018); except that, if a 20 referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the 21 state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect 22 23 unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in 24 November 2018 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the 25 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

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
