On Second Reading (04/28/16), the Senate amended the printed bill by striking everything below the enacting clause and creating the Legislative Interim Committee on 911 Oversight, Outage Reporting, and Reliability. On Third Reading (04/29/16), the Senate added an appropriation clause providing the Legislative Department \$25,000 General Fund for FY 2016-17 for the implementation of this act. The House Business Affairs and Labor Committee Report (05/10/16) amends the reengrossed bill reducing to six the number of committee members serving on the Legislative Interim Committee and reducing to three the number of times the Committee meets during the 2016 interim. Legislative Council Fiscal Note Staff and JBC Staff agree on the updated fiscal impact of this bill, which is as follows:

Points to Consider

General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2016-17 based on the March 2016 Legislative Council Staff revenue forecast. The budget package allocates \$3.0 million General Fund to be available to fund 2016 legislation that is not accounted for in the budget package. If the full \$3.0 million is not used to fund legislation, it will remain in the General Fund reserve.
