1 2 3	WHEREAS, Our respected colleague, Kimmi J. Lewis, a member of the Colorado General Assembly, departed this life on December 6, 2019; and

4	WHEREAS, Representative Lewis was born on March 19, 1957,
5	in La Junta, Colorado, to Kenneth and Jewell Clark; and
6	WHEREAS, Representative Lewis was raised on her family's
7	cattle ranch halfway between Kim and La Junta, Colorado, where she and
8	her three older sisters worked as ranch hands; and
9	WHEREAS, While attending Kim High School, Representative
10	Lewis started her first cow herd, was the Most Valuable Basketball Player
11	in the women's "A" division, and was the Colorado Hereford Queen; and
12	WHEREAS, Representative Lewis attended Trinidad State Junior
13	College on a basketball scholarship where she majored in music; and
14	WHEREAS, In 1975, Representative Lewis married George David

1 2 3	"Dave" Lewis, her high school sweetheart, and in 1977, after her graduation from college, they moved to Branson, Colorado, and had six children; and
4 5 6	WHEREAS, In 1992, Representative Lewis and her husband purchased her family's ranch and operated it along with a cattle and feed hauling business; and
7 8 9	WHEREAS, After her husband Dave's death in 2000, Representative Lewis ran both businesses and raised her children, sending all six of them to college on academic and athletic scholarships; and
10 11 12 13	WHEREAS, Representative Lewis was an active member of the Las Animas Republican party and for 30 years served as the President of the Trinidad/Las Animas County Republican Women's Club and for many years served as the Chair for Senate District 2; and
14 15 16 17	WHEREAS, In 2016, Representative Lewis ran for and was elected to the State House of Representatives where she served as the Representative for House District 64, and was reelected to a second term in 2018; and
18 19 20 21 22 23	WHEREAS, While serving as a State Representative, Representative Lewis served on several committees, including Agriculture, Livestock, and Natural Resources; Public Heath Care and Human Services; Transportation and Energy; Rural Affairs and Agriculture; and Transportation and Local Government, and sponsored bills on beef country-of-origin and private property rights issues; and
24 25 26	WHEREAS, Representative Lewis battled breast cancer three times: In 2014, during the 2018 legislative session, and finally throughout 2019; and
27 28	WHEREAS, Representative Lewis is survived by her six children and fourteen grandchildren; and
