BILL TOPIC: AUTHORITY OF LOCAL GOVS PROMOTE AFFORDABLE HOUSING

NOTE: This bill was not enacted into law; therefore, the impacts identified in this analysis do not take effect.

Summary of Legislation

Current law prohibits local governments from enacting ordinances or resolutions that would control rent on private residential property. This bill excludes local government affordable housing programs that require land developers to mitigate the effects of new development from the prohibition on rent control, provided the program meets the following requirements.

- The program is adopted by ordinance or resolution.
- The program must be adopted to address the shortage of affordable housing resulting from the adverse effects of high levels of economic development within the city or county.
- The program must apply only to the construction of residential housing commenced on or after July 1, 2016.
- Any rental rate restriction cannot be related to the characteristics or zoning classification
 of a particular residential housing unit; rather a rental rate restriction must be based
 upon the number of employees generated by a particular development.
- If the program requires a land developer to generate a certain number of affordable housing units, the program must offer the developer alternate ways of mitigating the impact. The bill includes several suggestions of alternate methods of mitigation, including deed restrictions or a fee to the local government.

Local Government Impact

The bill does not impact expenditures for current affordable housing programs, but may impact expenditures for local governments that choose to create a relevant affordable housing program after July 1, 2016. The size and scope of the impact will be determined by the process to adopt an ordinance or resolution, type of program, characteristics of the city or county, as well as the types of new developments within the city or county.

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Effective Date

The bill was postponed indefinitely by the Senate Finance Committee on February 2, 2016.
