A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING THE CONTINUATION OF THE COLORADO HUMAN 102 TRAFFICKING COUNCIL.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Sunset Process - State, Veterans, and Military Affairs Committee. The bill continues the Colorado human trafficking council until September 1, 2024.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

1	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 18-3-505, amend
2	(1)(b)(XX), (1)(b)(XXII), (4)(f), and (6); repeal (4)(a)(I); and add
3	$\underline{(1)(b)(XXIV)}$ and $\underline{(1)(b)(XXV)}$ as follows:
4	18-3-505. Human trafficking council - created - duties - repeal.
5	(1) (b) The membership of the council must reflect, to the extent
6	possible, representation of urban and rural areas of the state and a balance
7	of expertise, both governmental and nongovernmental, in issues relating
8	to human trafficking. The council must include members with expertise
9	in child welfare and human services to address the unique needs of child
10	victims, including those child victims who are involved in the child
11	welfare system. The membership of the council consists of the following
12	persons, appointed as follows:
13	(XX) Two FOUR persons who are former victims of human
14	trafficking, one TWO who is a ARE former victim VICTIMS of human
15	trafficking for involuntary servitude and one TWO who is a ARE former
16	victim VICTIMS of human trafficking for sexual servitude, each to be
17	appointed by the governor or his or her designee;
18	(XXII) One person to be appointed by the commissioner of
19	agriculture; and
20	(XXIV) A REPRESENTATIVE OF A STATEWIDE COALITION FOR
21	<u>VICTIMS OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE, TO BE APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR OR</u>
22	HIS OR HER DESIGNEE; AND
23	(XXV) ONE PERSON WHO IS A SPECIALIST IN ISSUES OR RESEARCH
24	REGARDING INVOLUNTARY SERVITUDE TRAFFICKING, TO BE APPOINTED BY
25	THE GOVERNOR OR HIS OR HER DESIGNEE.
26	(4) The council shall hold its first meeting on or before November
27	1, 2014, at a time and place to be designated by the executive director of

2	shall meet at least four times each year and shall carry out the following
3	<u>duties:</u>
4	(a) On or before January 1, 2016, make recommendations to the
5	judiciary committees of the house of representatives and senate, or any

8	a process for the certification of organizations that provide services to
9	victims of human trafficking;
10	(f) Identify best practices for the prevention of ALL FORMS OF
11	human trafficking, particularly for the prevention of INCLUDING BUT NOT
12	LIMITED TO child sex trafficking AND INVOLUNTARY SERVITUDE
13	TRAFFICKING;
14	(6) This section is repealed, effective September 1, 2019
15	SEPTEMBER 1, 2024. Before repeal, the department of regulatory agencies
16	shall review the council pursuant to section 2-3-1203. C.R.S.
17	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 2-3-1203, repeal
18	(9)(a)(V); and add (15)(a)(VI) as follows:
19	2-3-1203. Sunset review of advisory committees - legislative
20	declaration - definition - repeal. (9) (a) The following statutory
21	authorizations for the designated advisory committees will repeal on
22	September 1, 2019:
23	(V) The Colorado human trafficking council created in section
