# **Description of Amendments in This Packet**

J.001 Staff has prepared amendment J.001 (attached) to add a provision that appropriates \$219,295 from the General Fund to the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing and reduces appropriations by \$44,204 from the General Fund for the Department of Public Health and Environment for FY 2021-22. This provision also states that the changes in appropriations are based on the assumption that the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing will require an additional 0.7 FTE and the Department of Public Health and Environment will require 0.4 FTE fewer. The net result across both departments is an increase of \$175,091 General Fund and 0.3 FTE.

#### **Points to Consider**

#### General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2021-22 based on the March 2021 Legislative Council Staff revenue forecast. The budget package includes a set aside of \$48.0 million General Fund for bills that require General Fund appropriations for FY 2021-22. This bill requires a General Fund appropriation of \$175,091 for FY 2021-22, reducing the \$48.0 million set aside by the same amount.

## Future Fiscal Impact

In FY 2022-23 the net fiscal impact of the bill increases to \$474,724 General Fund.
