A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING CRISIS SERVICES INFORMATION ON STUDENT 102 IDENTIFICATION CARDS.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://leg.colorado.gov.)

The bill requires public and private higher education institutions to print Colorado and national crisis and suicide prevention contact information on student identification cards. If an institution does not use student identification cards, the bill requires the school to distribute Colorado and national crisis and suicide prevention contact information to the student body each semester or trimester.

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	SECTION 1. Legislative declaration. (1) The general assembly
3	finds and declares that:
4	(a) Young adulthood, which is commonly considered to be ages
5	19 to 24, is a time of often stressful transitions during which some major
6	mental health conditions first emerge. Young adults with untreated or
7	undiagnosed behavioral health problems often face academic and
8	personal problems and sometimes drop out of school. This age group also
9	has a significantly higher rate of suicide compared to youth ages 10 to 18.
10	The Colorado department of public health and environment reports that
11	between 2003 and 2017 there were 1,290 suicides among young adults
12	ages 19 to 24 and 696 suicides among youth ages 10 to 18.
13	(b) Providing access to mental health care is one way to prevent
14	suicide. The American Foundation for Suicide Prevention reports in a
15	2022 policy paper on suicide on university and college campuses that only
16	half of enrolled students said they knew where to find mental health
17	services. This suggests that postsecondary institutions should make
18	students more aware of suicide prevention resources and services.
19	(2) Therefore, it is the intent of the general assembly that this bill
20	increase awareness of mental health resources, and the general assembly
21	recognizes this awareness as an important step toward preventing suicide
22	and promoting well-being among young adults.
23	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, amend 23-5-109 as
24	follows:
25	23-5-109. Identification - suicide and crisis prevention - rules.
26	(1) The governing board of any state institution of higher education is

authorized to promulgate rules and regulations establishing a system of identification of students, faculty, and staff which THAT may include provisions for penalties other than criminal penalties and provisions for disciplinary action for failure to display one's identification card upon request by an authorized official, possession of a false identification card, and alteration of an identification card. The authorized officials of such institution have authority to detain a person upon the property under the control of the institution for the purpose of obtaining proper identification if such person refuses to display his THE PERSON'S identification card or otherwise give adequate identification upon request by an authorized official.

(2) EACH STUDENT IDENTIFICATION CARD ISSUED AFTER AUGUST 1, 2023, TO A PUBLIC OR PRIVATE POSTSECONDARY SCHOOL STUDENT MUST INCLUDE THE PHONE NUMBER AND TEXT TALK NUMBER FOR THE STATEWIDE BEHAVIORAL HEALTH CRISIS RESPONSE SYSTEM, COMMONLY REFERRED TO AS "COLORADO CRISIS SERVICES", AS DESCRIBED IN SECTION 27-60-104, AND THE NATIONAL THREE-DIGIT SUICIDE AND CRISIS LIFELINE NUMBER 988. THE PUBLIC OR PRIVATE POSTSECONDARY SCHOOL MAY INCLUDE INFORMATION ABOUT OTHER AVAILABLE CRISIS SERVICES AND OTHER SERVICES ON THE IDENTIFICATION CARD, INCLUDING LOCAL CAMPUS CRISIS AND SUICIDE PREVENTION NUMBERS. THE PUBLIC OR PRIVATE POSTSECONDARY SCHOOL IS NOT REQUIRED TO REPRINT OR REISSUE IDENTIFICATION CARDS IN USE BEFORE AUGUST 1, 2023. IF, AT ANY TIME, A PRIVATE OR PUBLIC POSTSECONDARY SCHOOL HAS CURRENT STUDENTS STILL USING IDENTIFICATION CARDS WITHOUT THE INFORMATION REQUIRED BY THIS SECTION, THE SCHOOL SHALL DISTRIBUTE THE PHONE NUMBER AND TEXT TALK NUMBER FOR COLORADO CRISIS

11	SECTION 3. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
12	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate

preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.
