## A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING MODIFICATION OF ANNUAL TRANSFERS FROM THE 102 GENERAL FUND TO THE STATE HIGHWAY FUND.

## **Bill Summary**

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. **Joint Budget Committee.** The bill modifies the schedule and amounts of annual transfers from the general fund to the state highway fund as follows:

- The \$100 million transfer to the state highway fund scheduled for July 1, 2025, is reduced to \$36 million;
- The \$100 million transfer to the state highway fund

- scheduled for July 1, 2026, is reduced to \$50.5 million;
- The \$82.5 million transfers to the state highway fund scheduled for each July 1 from July 1, 2029, through July 1, 2031, are increased to \$100 million;
- A new \$61 million transfer to the state highway fund is scheduled for July 1, 2032; and
- The \$7 million transfers to the state highway fund for the purpose of providing additional funding for the revitalizing main streets program scheduled for each July 1 from July 1, 2025, through July 1, 2031, are eliminated.

13	SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly finds,
14	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
15	preservation of the public peace, health, or safety or for appropriations for
16	the support and maintenance of the departments of the state and state
17	institutions.
