## A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING THE COMPOSITION OF THE COLORADO OPPORTUNITY
102 SCHOLARSHIP INITIATIVE ADVISORY BOARD.

### **Bill Summary**

The bill amends the composition of the Colorado opportunity scholarship initiative advisory board.

22	(III) This subsection (1)(b) is repealed, effective July 1,

24	(2) The governor or his or her designee shall make his or her
25	appointments to the board on or before August 1, 2014. The members of
26	the board shall elect presiding officers for the board, including a chair and
27	vice-chair, from among the board members appointed pursuant to

subsection (1) SUBSECTION (1)(a) of this section, which presiding officers shall serve terms of two years. Board members may reelect a presiding officer.

(3) Each member of the board appointed by the governor or his or her designee shall serve SERVES at the pleasure of the governor or his or her designee THE MEMBER'S APPOINTING AUTHORITY for a term of four years. The governor or his or her designee APPOINTING AUTHORITY may reappoint the member for an additional term or terms. Members of the board shall serve without compensation MEMBERS OF THE BOARD MUST RECEIVE SEVENTY-FIVE DOLLARS PER DIEM FOR ATTENDANCE AT OFFICIAL MEETINGS PLUS REIMBURSEMENT FOR ACTUAL AND NECESSARY EXPENSES INCURRED IN THE CONDUCT OF OFFICIAL BUSINESS; EXCEPT THAT A MEMBER SHALL NOT RECEIVE THE PER DIEM ALLOWANCE PROVIDED FOR IN THIS SUBSECTION (3) IF THE MEMBER RECEIVES A SALARY FROM THE STATE FOR A FULL-TIME POSITION WITH THE STATE.

SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-46.3-101, repeal (12) as follows:

24-46.3-101. State work force development council - creation
- membership - funding through gifts, grants, and donations.

(12) (a) The members of the executive committee of the state council shall serve as members of the Colorado opportunity scholarship initiative advisory board created pursuant to section 23-3.3-1004, C.R.S.

(b) The executive committee of the state council shall identify staff members within the department of education created pursuant to section 24-1-115, the department of higher education created pursuant to section 24-1-114, and the department of labor and employment created pursuant to section 24-1-121 who shall be charged with assisting the state
