Bill Summary

Statutory Revision Committee. The bill clarifies that members of the radiation advisory committee are reimbursed for necessary and actual expenses incurred in attendance at meetings or for authorized business of the committee.

SENATE 2nd Reading Unamended January 22, 2019 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

SECTION 1. Legislative declaration. The general assembly declares that the purpose of this act is to correct defects in the law. The general assembly further declares that clarifying these statutory provisions does not alter the scope or applicability of the remaining statutes.

SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 25-11-105, **amend** (1) as follows:

25-11-105. Radiation advisory committee. (1) The governor shall appoint a radiation advisory committee of nine members, no more than four of whom shall represent any one political party and three of whom shall represent industry, three the healing arts, and three the public and private institutions of higher education. Members of the committee shall serve at the discretion of the governor and shall be ARE reimbursed for necessary and actual expenses incurred in attendance at meetings or for authorized business of the board COMMITTEE. The committee shall furnish to the department such technical advice as may be desirable or required on matters relating to the radiation control program.

SECTION 3. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August 2, 2019, if adjournment sine die is on May 3, 2019); except that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
