A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING THE MODIFICATION OF THE SALARY CATEGORIZATION OF 102 LOCALLY ELECTED OFFICERS IN SPECIFIED COUNTIES.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://leg.colorado.gov.)

Current law categorizes each county for purposes of establishing the salaries of elected officials in the county. The statutory salary amounts are adjusted every 2 years for inflation and take effect for terms commencing after any change is made. The bill modifies the categories of 4 counties with the accompanying percentage increase in salary as follows:

- Archuleta county changes from category III-B to category III-A (8% increase);
- Delta county changes from category III-B to category III-A (8% increase);
- Saguache county changes from category V-B to category V-A (8% increase); and
- Summit county changes from category II-A to category I-A (18.5% increase for commissioners, treasurers, assessors, and clerks; 22.2% increase for surveyors; 23.5% increase for sheriffs; 65.5% increase for coroners).

- 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 30-2-102, amend

- 10 Arapahoe, Boulder, Douglas, El Paso, Jefferson, Larimer, Pueblo,
- 11 SUMMIT, and Weld;
- 12 (II) (A) Category II-A counties consist of the counties of Eagle,
- Garfield, La Plata, AND Routt; and Summit;
- 14 (III) (A) Category III-A counties consist of the counties of
- 15 ARCHULETA, Chaffee, Clear Creek, DELTA, Gunnison, Moffat, Montrose,
- Morgan, Park, Rio Blanco, San Miguel, and Teller;
- 17 (B) Category III-B counties consist of the counties of Alamosa,
- 18 Archuleta, Delta, Gilpin, Grand, and Logan;
- 19 (V) (A) Category V-A counties consist of the counties of Baca,
- 20 Conejos, Costilla, Lincoln, Mineral, Phillips, SAGUACHE, and San Juan;

1	(B) Category V-B counties consist of the counties of Crowley AND
2	Hinsdale; and Saguache;
3	SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
4	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
5	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except
6	that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V
7	of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this
8	act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take
9	effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
10	November 2024 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
11	official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
