ADMINISTRATOR OF JUDICIAL SECURITY PEACE OFFICER STATUS Bill Topic:

> This bill designates an administrator of judicial security in the Colorado Judicial Department as a peace officer who must be certified as such. The bill results in one

time revenue, expenditures and workload increases.

Appropriation Summary:

No appropriation is required.

Fiscal Note Status:

Summary of Legislation

This bill designates an administrator of judicial security in the Colorado Judicial Department as a peace officer who must be certified by the Colorado Peace Officers Standards and Training (POST) Board.

State Revenue and Expenditures

In the current FY 2017-18, one position within the Judicial Department will need to become POST certified. The applicant will need to obtain a fingerprint background check from the Colorado Bureau of Investigation (CBI) in the Department of Public Safety and pay a fee of \$39.50. Workload and expenditures will increase for the CBI to conduct the background check and pass through a portion of this fee to the federal government. The applicant will also need to sit for the POST examination, which requires a fee of \$150, payable to the POST Board in the Department of Law. These costs will be paid from the Court Security Cash Fund in the Judicial Department. Similar impacts will occur in the future if a new person is appointed to the position of the administrator of judicial security.

HB 18-1210

Effective Date

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.
