Summary of Legislation

This *reengrossed* bill adds charitable trusts, civil leagues or organizations, and veterans' service organizations to the list of entities that may accept court assignments for individuals performing community or useful public service assignments. Under the bill, the court or other entity making the assignment retains the discretion to determine which organizations may be included in its program.

State Expenditures

The bill may increase workload for state-operated county courts and probation departments to determine which, if any, of the new types of organizations should be included in their programs. This workload increase is assumed to be minimal and will not require an increase in appropriations for any agency within the Judicial Department.

Local Government Impact

Similar to the state, this bill may increase workload for local governments that operate community or useful public service programs to assess the eligibility of new types of organizations, including the City and County of Denver and sheriffs offices. The fiscal note assumes this increase is minimal.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.
