## A BILL FOR AN ACT

101	CONCERNING INCREASING THE CAPACITY OF QUALITY EARLY
102	CHILDHOOD EDUCATION THROUGH GRANT PROGRAMS, AND, IN
103	CONNECTION THEREWITH, MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

### **Bill Summary**

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://leg.colorado.gov.)

The bill creates 4 new grant programs to increase capacity for early childhood care and education, improve recruitment and retention rates for early childhood educators (educators), and improve salaries for educators. Specifically, the bill creates the following programs:

The employer-based child care facility grant program;

Shading denotes HOUSE amendment. Double underlining denotes SENATE amendment. Capital letters or bold & italic numbers indicate new material to be added to existing statute. Dashes through the words indicate deletions from existing statute.

- The early care and education recruitment and retention grant and scholarship program;
- The child care teacher salary grant program; and
- The community innovation and resilience for care and learning equity (CIRCLE) grant program.

The bill also eliminates the repeal dates for the child care sustainability grant program and the emerging and expanding child care grant program.

The bill appropriates money for the grant programs from the general fund as well as from federal funds from the child care development fund.

SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 26-6-802, amend

(4)(a) and (5); and repeal (6) as follows:

**26-6-802.** Child care sustainability grant program - created - timeline and criteria - grant awards - definitions. (4) (a) The state department shall develop a formula to allocate money from the grant program to all eligible entities. The key criteria for a grant award to an eligible entity is the eligible entity's licensed child care capacity. In determining grant awards, the department shall also take into consideration the criteria set forth in subsection (4)(b) of this section. The state department is responsible for communicating important dates and the criteria for grant awards to eligible entities in the state. Grant awards must range from at least five hundred dollars to no more than thirty-five thousand dollars.

(5) The department shall determine grant award amounts for eligible entities as soon as possible. but no later than January 31, 2021, and distribute the money for grant awards no later than February 28, 2021.

(6) This section is repealed, effective June 30, 2023.
