## **Current Appropriations Clause in Bill**

The bill includes an appropriation clause that appropriates a total of \$149,990 for FY 2017-18, including \$103,762 General Fund and \$46,228 cash funds from the Hospital Provider Fee Cash Fund. Of the total, \$8,100 General Fund is for the Department of Personnel and the remaining \$141,890, including \$95,662 General Fund and \$46,228 cash funds, is for the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing. The provision also states that the appropriation for the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing is based on the assumption that the Department will require an additional 0.7 FTE, and the Department will receive \$141,891 federal funds to implement the act.

#### **Points to Consider**

#### General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2017-18 based on the March 2017 Legislative Council Staff revenue forecast. The budget package allocates \$11.7 million General Fund to be available to fund 2017 legislation that is not accounted for in the budget package. If the full \$11.7 million is not used to fund legislation, it will remain in the General Fund reserve.
