Summary of Legislation

This *Joint Budget Committee* bill recreates the State Contingency Reserve Fund in statute without substantive change. Prior to FY 2015-16, the fund existed as a source of supplemental assistance for school districts demonstrating increased financial need due to certain, specified circumstances. The State Board of Education reviewed district applications for supplemental assistance and approved payments to districts that could demonstrate need under specified circumstances. The fund was mistakenly repealed from statute on July 1, 2015.

Background

In 2014, the General Assembly enacted House Bill 14-1250 to authorize one-time assistance for districts impacted by the September 2013 floods and for districts experiencing significant reductions in total program funding mid-year as a result of unanticipated declines in local share. Because the assistance was intended to be one-time, the bill included language to repeal as of July 1, 2015, but mistakenly repealed the whole section instead of the intended sub-section, including the Contingency Reserve Fund. There have been no expenditures from the fund since FY 2013-14, and there are currently no requests pending with the Colorado Department of Education. According to the department, the current fund balance is \$1,080,000. No new appropriation is required as money in the fund is already appropriated to the department.

State Expenditures

Colorado Department of Education. Absent this bill, the department will not be able to use money in the fund to provide supplemental assistance to school districts. While there is currently a fund balance of \$1,080,000, there are no applications for assistance on file with the department. However, this bill will allow the money to be spent.

School District Impact

This bill allows school districts to be able to receive supplemental assistance funding.

Effective Date

The bill was signed into law by the Governor and took effect on March 18, 2016.
