¹ The fund is continuously appropriated and the \$5.0 million transferred into the fund may be spent over multiple years. The fiscal note assumes funding will primarily be spent over three years through FY 2025-26.

Summary of Legislation

The bill transfers \$5 million from the General Fund to the Colorado Economic Development Fund in FY 2022-23 to use in connection with the federal Creating Helpful Incentives to Produce Semiconductors and Science (CHIPS) Act of 2022. The bill requires that the Office of Economic Development and International Trade (OEDIT) to annually submit a report to the Joint Budget Committee detailing how the transferred money is spent, and all projects funded by the CHIPS Act.

State Transfers

The bill transfers \$5.0 million from the General Fund to the Colorado Economic Development Fund on April 1, 2023.

State Expenditures

The bill increases cash fund expenditures in OEDIT by \$5.0 million, beginning in FY 2022-23. The funds may be spent over multiple years; the fiscal note assumes the funds will be spent beginning in the FY 2022-23, with the majority of funding spent over the three subsequent fiscal years. The amount transferred is expected to be used as a state match for the federal funding through the CHIPS Act, and will cover the cost of 1.0 FTE to serve as an expert on the CHIPS Act, provide technical assistance to rural and underserved communities, and complete the required reporting. In FY 2022-23, the staff is prorated to 0.3 FTE.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.
