Current Appropriations Clause in Bill

The bill includes an appropriation clause that includes following changes to appropriations to the Department of Education for FY 2021-22: (1) an increase of \$2,922,976 General Fund which the provision makes available to the Department for two years (through FY 2022-23); and (2) a reduction of \$292,532 cash funds from the Educator Licensure Cash Fund and 4.0 associated FTE.

General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee (JBC) has proposed a budget package for FY 2021-22 based on the

JBC Staff Fiscal Analysis 1

March 2021 Legislative Council Staff revenue forecast. The JBC has included as part of its FY 2021-22 budget package \$3,400,000 General Fund to be appropriated for implementation of this bill. Specifically, the JBC package includes a place holder of \$800.0 million General Fund for those bills that are part of the "State Stimulus Package", and this bill is part of that package. The bill currently includes an appropriation of \$2,922,976 General Fund for FY 2021-22.
