# CONCERNING THE CONTINUATION OF THE SURGICAL ASSISTANT AND SURGICAL TECHNOLOGIST REGISTRATION PROGRAM.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

### **Bill Summary**

Sunset Process - House Health, Insurance, and Environment Committee. The bill continues the requirement that surgical technicians and surgical assistants register with the director of the division of professions and occupations in the department of regulatory agencies.

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-43.2-102, amend
3	(1) (a) and (2) (a) as follows:
4	12-43.2-102. Registration - penalty - renewal - database - fees
5	- rules. (1) On and after April 1, 2011:
6	(a) No A person may NOT perform the duties of a surgical
7	assistant or surgical technologist unless the person is registered by the
8	director. PRIOR TO REGISTRATION, A PERSON SHALL SUBMIT TO A CRIMINAL
9	HISTORY RECORD CHECK IN THE FORM AND MANNER AS DESCRIBED IN
10	SECTION 12-43.2-105.5.
11	(2) (a) Registrations made pursuant to this article are valid for the
12	period of time established by the director. Each registrant shall renew his
13	or her registration according to a schedule set by the director. If a
14	registrant does not renew his or her registration according to the schedule,
15	the registration expires. A person whose registration has expired shall not
16	perform the duties of a surgical assistant or surgical technologist until he
17	or she reinstates the registration. THE DIRECTOR SHALL NOT REINSTATE
18	THE REGISTRATION UNTIL THE PERSON SUBMITS TO A CRIMINAL HISTORY
19	RECORD CHECK IN THE FORM AND MANNER AS DESCRIBED IN SECTION
20	12-43.2-105.5.
21	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-43.2-104, add (3)
22	as follows:
23	12-43.2-104. Employers - requirements - references. (3) AN
24	EMPLOYER WHO REQUIRES A REGISTRANT APPLYING FOR EMPLOYMENT TO
25	SUBMIT TO A DRUG TEST SHALL FORWARD TO THE DIRECTOR ANY
26	CONFIRMED POSITIVE DRUG TEST RESULTS FOR A CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE
2.7	THAT IS NOT SUBJECT TO A VALID PRESCRIPTION

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1	<b>SECTION 3.</b> In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 12-43.2-105.5
2	as follows:
3	12-43.2-105.5. Criminal history record check required. EACH
4	APPLICANT FOR REGISTRATION SHALL HAVE HIS OR HER FINGERPRINTS
5	TAKEN BY A LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY FOR THE PURPOSE OF
6	OBTAINING A FINGERPRINT-BASED CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD CHECK. THE
7	APPLICANT IS REQUIRED TO SUBMIT PAYMENT BY CERTIFIED CHECK OR
8	MONEY ORDER FOR THE FINGERPRINTS AND FOR THE ACTUAL COSTS OF THE
9	RECORD CHECK AT THE TIME THE FINGERPRINTS ARE SUBMITTED TO THE
10	COLORADO BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION. UPON RECEIPT OF FINGERPRINTS
11	AND RECEIPT OF THE PAYMENT FOR COSTS, THE COLORADO BUREAU OF
12	INVESTIGATION SHALL CONDUCT A STATE AND NATIONAL
13	FINGERPRINT-BASED CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD CHECK UTILIZING
14	RECORDS OF THE COLORADO BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION AND THE
15	FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION AND SHALL FORWARD THE RESULTS
16	OF THE CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD CHECK TO THE DIRECTOR.
17	SECTION 4. In Colorado Revised Statutes, amend 12-43.2-107
18	as follows:
19	12-43.2-107. Repeal of article. This article is repealed, effective
20	September 1, <del>2016</del> 2021. Prior to such repeal, the registration of surgical
21	assistants and surgical technologists shall be reviewed as provided in
22	section 24-34-104, C.R.S.
23	<b>SECTION 5.</b> In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-34-104, repeal
24	(47.5) (b); and <b>add</b> (52.5) (f) as follows:
25	24-34-104. General assembly review of regulatory agencies
26	and functions for termination, continuation, or reestablishment.
27	(47.5) The following agencies, functions, or both, shall terminate on

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1	September 1, 2016:
2	(b) The registration of surgical assistants and surgical
3	technologists pursuant to article 43.2 of title 12, C.R.S.;
4	(52.5) The following agencies, functions, or both, terminate on
5	September 1, 2021:
6	(f) THE REGISTRATION OF SURGICAL ASSISTANTS AND SURGICAL
7	TECHNOLOGISTS PURSUANT TO ARTICLE 43.2 OF TITLE 12, C.R.S.
8	SECTION 6. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
9	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
10	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August
11	10, 2016, if adjournment sine die is on May 11, 2016); except that, if a
12	referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the
13	state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act
14	within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect
15	unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
16	November 2016 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
17	official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

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
