HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 22-1006 101 SUBMITTING TO THE REGISTERED ELECTORS OF THE STATE OF 102 COLORADO AN AMENDMENT TO THE COLORADO CONSTITUTION 103 CONCERNING THE CONDUCT OF CHARITABLE GAMING 104 ACTIVITIES, AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, ALLOWING 105 MANAGERS AND OPERATORS TO BE PAID AND REPEALING THE 106 REQUIRED PERIOD OF A CHARITABLE ORGANIZATION'S 107 CONTINUOUS EXISTENCE BEFORE OBTAINING A CHARITABLE 108 **GAMING LICENSE.**

Resolution Summary

The concurrent resolution amends section 2 of article XVIII of the Colorado constitution by:

- Repealing the 5-year continuous existence requirement to obtain a charitable gaming license; and
- Authorizing a manager or operator of a charitable game to make minimum wage until 2024, when the provision repeals the prohibition on paying managers or operators.

Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Seventy-third General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the Senate concurring herein:

SECTION 1. At the election held on November 8, 2022, the secretary of state shall submit to the registered electors of the state the ballot title set forth in section 2 for the following amendment to the state constitution:

In the constitution of the state of Colorado, section 2 of article XVIII, **amend** (2) and (4)(c) as follows:

Section 2. Lotteries prohibited - exceptions - repeal. (2) No game of chance pursuant to this subsection (2) and subsections (3) and (4) of this section shall be conducted by any person, firm, or organization, unless a license as provided for in this subsection (2) has been issued to the firm or organization conducting such games of chance. The secretary of state shall, upon application therefor FOR A LICENSE on such forms as shall be prescribed by the secretary of state and upon the payment of an annual fee as determined by the general assembly, issue a license for the conducting of such games of chance to any bona fide chartered branch or lodge or chapter of a national or state organization or to any bona fide religious, charitable, labor, fraternal, educational, voluntary firemen's, or veterans' organization which THAT operates without profit to its members

1	and which has been in existence continuously for a period of five years
2	immediately prior to the making of said application for such license and
3	THAT has had during the entire five-year period OF ITS EXISTENCE a
4	dues-paying membership engaged in carrying out the objects of said
5	corporation or organization. such THE license to expire EXPIRES at the end
6	of each calendar year in which it was issued.
7	(4) Such games of chance shall be subject to the following
8	restrictions:
9	(c) (I) No person may receive any remuneration or profit IN
10	EXCESS OF THE APPLICABLE MINIMUM WAGE for participating in the
11	management or operation of any such A game OF CHANCE.
12	(II) This subsection (4)(c) is repealed, effective July $1,2024$.
13	SECTION 2. Each elector voting at the election may cast a vote
14	either "Yes/For" or "No/Against" on the following ballot title: "Shall
15	there be an amendment to the Colorado constitution concerning the
16	conduct of charitable gaming activities, and, in connection therewith,
17	allowing managers and operators to be paid and repealing the required
18	period of a charitable organization's continuous existence before
19	obtaining a charitable gaming license?"
20	SECTION 3. Except as otherwise provided in section 1-40-123,
21	Colorado Revised Statutes, if at least fifty-five percent of the electors
22	voting on the ballot title vote "Yes/For", then the amendment will become

part of the state constitution.
