A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING CLARIFYING THAT WORKERS' COMPENSATION IS NOT

THE EXCLUSIVE REMEDY FOR PERSONS AGGRIEVED BY

VIOLATIONS OF THE "COLORADO YOUTH EMPLOYMENT

OPPORTUNITY ACT OF 1971".

Bill Summary

The bill amends the "Colorado Youth Employment Opportunity Act of 1971" (act) to allow aggrieved parties, including parents of children protected by the act, to pursue remedies at law and in equity for

violations of the act that are not within the scope of workers' compensation remedies.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 1 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, amend 8-12-117 as 3 follows: 4 8-12-117. Remedies for violations - workers' compensation -5 remedies at law and in equity. (1) All minors, whether lawfully or 6 unlawfully employed, shall be ARE subject to the rights and remedies of 7 the "Workers' Compensation Act of Colorado", articles 40 to 47 of this 8 title TITLE 8, if the employer is included within the meaning of section 9 8-40-203. 10 (2) PERSONS AGGRIEVED BY VIOLATIONS OF THIS ARTICLE 12 MAY 11 PURSUE REMEDIES AT LAW AND IN EQUITY, INCLUDING REMEDIES IN TORT, 12 OR REMEDIES UNDER THE "WORKERS' COMPENSATION ACT OF 13 COLORADO", ARTICLES 40 TO 47 OF THIS TITLE 8, DEPENDING ON THE 14 NATURE OF THE VIOLATION. 15 **SECTION 2.** Effective date - applicability. This act takes effect 16 July 1, 2023, and applies to violations committed on or after said date. 17 **SECTION 3.** Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds, 18 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate 19 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.
