# **Description of Amendments in This Packet**

#### J.001

Staff amendment **J.001** (attached) appropriates \$150,000 General Fund to the Department of Public Safety.

#### L.004/J.002

Bill Sponsor amendment **L.004** (attached) eliminates the statewide coordinator grant program and establishes a review board in the Department of Law. Amendment **J.002** (attached) appropriates \$39,938

General Fund to the Department of Law and reflects 0.5 FTE. An optional appropriation for per diem expenses estimated at \$13,200 is not included in the appropriation clause. Legislative Council Staff and JBC Staff agree on this preliminary assessment of fiscal impact.

# **Points to Consider**

## **General Fund Impact**

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2025-26 based on the March 2025 Office of State Planning and Budgeting (OSPB) revenue forecast. The budget package includes \$18.2 million in set-asides for legislation outside of the package (see table below). The budget package accounts for the 15.0 percent reserve associated with the placeholders.

This bill requires a General Fund appropriation of \$150,000 for FY 2025-26, reducing the \$18.2 million set aside by the same amount. If amendment **L.004** is adopted, the bill requires a General Fund appropriation of \$39,938, reducing the \$18.2 million set aside by the same amount.
