#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING THE EXTENSION OF THE SALES AND USE TAX EXEMPTION

#### FOR BEETLE KILL WOOD PRODUCTS.

### **Bill Summary**

Statutes exempted the sale of wood and wood products from trees killed by pine and spruce beetles in the state from sales and use tax from 2008 through June 2020. The bill extends the exemption through June 2026.

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 39-26-723, amend
3	(1) and (3) as follows:
4	39-26-723. Colorado wood products - repeal. (1) For fiscal
5	years commencing on or after July 1, 2008, but prior to the fiscal year
6	commencing on July 1, 2020, JULY 1, 2026, all sales, storage, and use of
7	wood from salvaged trees killed or infested in Colorado by mountain pine
8	beetles or spruce beetles, including but not limited to products such as
9	lumber, furniture built from the salvaged trees, and wood chips or wood
10	pellets generated from the salvaged trees, are exempt from taxation under
11	the provisions of parts 1 and 2 of this article ARTICLE 26.
12	(3) This section is repealed, effective July 1, 2021 JULY 1, 2027.
13	SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
14	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
15	preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.
