A BILL FOR AN ACT CONCERNING IMPLEMENTING THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE MEDIA LITERACY ADVISORY COMMITTEE IN ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY EDUCATION CREATED PURSUANT TO HOUSE BILL 104 19-1110.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill requires the department of education (department) to create and maintain an online resource bank of materials and resources pertaining to media literacy. At a minimum, the resource bank must HOUSE 3rd Reading Unamended March 22, 2021

HOUSE Amended 2nd Reading March 19, 2021 include the materials and resources recommended in the media literacy advisory committee's report.

The bill requires the department, upon the request of a school district, charter school, institute charter school, or board of cooperative services, and subject to available resources, to provide technical assistance to a school district, charter school, institute charter school, or board of cooperative services, with implementing policies and procedures, best practices, and recommendations related to media literacy.

The bill requires the state board of education to review and adopt revisions that implement media literacy within reading, writing, and civics standards.

2 **SECTION 1. Legislative declaration.** (1) The general assembly finds and declares that:

- (a) Freedom of speech is a right that must not be infringed. In order to protect and reinforce this important right, the functioning of our democracy requires that Coloradans possess the ability to understand context and think critically about the information they are presented.
- (b) The growth of social media platforms and their integration into the media diet of Coloradans has created an opportunity for the rapid and widespread dissemination of misinformation; and
- (c) While the increase of misinformation has created significant divisions in our society, Coloradans maintain more in common than not. Our ability to unite and collaborate toward successful solutions for the benefit of all Coloradans depends upon our ability to collectively identify and critically examine facts.
- (2) Therefore, the general assembly declares that equipping the youth of Colorado with the critical thinking skills necessary to analyze the information, claims, and sources presented to them through media will empower them to make more informed decisions, serve to strengthen our
