Bill Summary

The bill allows a driver of a motorcycle to proceed past a traffic control signal that is inoperative, that remains on steady red or steady yellow for 2 minutes or more, or that fails to recognize the motorcycle for 2 minutes or more.

2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 42-4-612, amend (1)
3	as follows:
4	42-4-612. When signals are inoperative or malfunctioning.
5	(1)(a) Whenever WHEN a driver approaches an intersection and faces a
6	traffic control signal which THAT is inoperative, or which THAT remains
7	on steady red or steady yellow during several time cycles, OR THAT DOES
8	NOT RECOGNIZE A MOTORCYCLE THAT IS OPERATED BY THE DRIVER, the
9	<u>rules</u> PROVISIONS controlling entrance to a through street or highway from
10	a stop street SIGN or highway, as provided under section 42-4-703, shall
11	apply until a police officer assumes control of traffic or until THE TRAFFIC
12	CONTROL SIGNAL RESUMES normal operation. is resumed.
13	(b) In the event that any IF A traffic control signal at a place other
14	than an intersection should cease CEASES to operate or should malfunction
15	as set forth in this section MALFUNCTIONS AS SPECIFIED IN SUBSECTION
16	(1)(a) OF THIS SECTION, drivers may proceed through PAST the inoperative
17	or malfunctioning signal only with caution, as if the signal were one of
18	flashing yellow.

20	SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
21	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
22	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August
23	2, 2019, if adjournment sine die is on May 3, 2019); except that, if a
24	referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the
25	state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act
26	within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect
27	unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
