A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING AN EXPANSION OF MEDICAL MARIJUANA RESEARCH GRANT PROGRAMS.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://leg.colorado.gov.)

The bill expands the medical marijuana research grant program by:

- Providing grant funding for research intended to ascertain the safety of medical marijuana products; and
- Encouraging the state board of health to prioritize grants to research the safety of medical marijuana products and the safety of administering medical marijuana for

posttraumatic stress disorder.

The bill requires the state treasurer to transfer \$3 million from the general fund to the health research subaccount in the medical marijuana cash fund for the purpose of providing research grants and administering the grant program.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 1 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 25-1.5-106.5, amend 3 (1), (2)(a)(II), (2)(b)(II)(D), (2)(b)(II)(E), (2)(d)(I), (3)(b)(I), (4)(b)4 introductory portion, and (4)(b)(II); repeal (4)(a); and add (2)(b)(II)(F), 5 (4)(b)(II.5), and (7) as follows: 6 25-1.5-106.5. Medical marijuana research grant program -7 scientific advisory council - reporting - rules - definition -8 **appropriation - repeal.** (1) **Legislative intent.** There is a need for 9 objective scientific research regarding the SAFETY AND efficacy of 10 marijuana and its component parts as part of medical treatment. It is the 11 intent of the general assembly that the department gather objective 12 scientific research regarding the SAFETY OF MEDICAL MARIJUANA 13 PRODUCTS AND THE efficacy of administering marijuana and its 14 component parts as part of medical treatment. 15 Medical marijuana research grant program - rules. 16 (a) (II) The department shall coordinate the grant program to fund 17 research intended to ascertain the SAFETY OF MEDICAL MARIJUANA 18 PRODUCTS AND THE general medical efficacy and appropriate 19 administration of marijuana and its component parts. The grant program 20 shall be limited to providing for FUNDING objective scientific research to 21 ascertain the SAFETY OF MEDICAL MARIJUANA PRODUCTS AND THE efficacy 22 of marijuana and its component parts as part of medical treatment and 23 should not be construed as encouraging or sanctioning the social or

4	administration of the grant program, including:

6	(D) For any research studies, demonstration that appropriate
7	protocols for adequate patient consent and follow-up procedures are in
8	place; and
9	(E) A process for a grant research proposal approved by the grant
10	program to be reviewed and approved by an institutional review board
11	that is able to approve, monitor, and review biomedical and behavioral
12	research involving human subjects; AND
13	(F) PROTOCOLS SUITABLE FOR STUDYING THE SAFETY OF MEDICAL
14	MARIJUANA PRODUCTS THROUGH VARIOUS COLLECTION AND TESTING
15	METHODS OF THE MEDICAL MARIJUANA PRODUCTS.
16	(d) In order to maximize the scope and size of the marijuana
17	studies:
18	(I) The grant program may solicit, apply for, and accept moneys
19	MONEY from foundations, private individuals, and all other funding
20	sources that can be used to expand the scope or time frame of the
21	marijuana studies that are authorized under this section; except that the
22	GRANT program shall not accept any moneys that are MONEY THAT IS
23	offered with any conditions other than that the moneys MONEY be used to
24	study the SAFETY OF MEDICAL MARIJUANA PRODUCTS AND THE efficacy of
25	marijuana and its component parts as part of medical treatment; and
26	(3) Review of applications. (b) Grant approval. (I) The council
27	shall submit recommendations for grants to the state board of health. The

state board of health shall approve or disapprove of grants submitted by the council. The state board of health is encouraged to prioritize grants to gather objective scientific research regarding the SAFETY OF MEDICAL MARIJUANA PRODUCTS AND THE efficacy and the safety of administering medical marijuana for ovarian cancer; dementia; POSTTRAUMATIC STRESS DISORDER; pediatric conditions, including but not limited to autism spectrum disorder; and other conditions that the state board OF HEALTH deems suitable. If the state board of health disapproves a recommendation, the council may submit a replacement recommendation within thirty days.

- (4) **Reporting.** (a) No later than January 1, 2016, the grant program shall report to the state board of health on the progress of the medical marijuana studies.
- (b) Thereafter, The grant program shall issue a report to the state board of health by January 1 of each year detailing the progress of the medical marijuana studies. The interim reports required under this paragraph (b) SUBSECTION (4)(b) shall include data on all of the following:
- (II) The number of patients enrolled in each study by disease; and
- (II.5) THE TYPES OF SAFETY TESTS PERFORMED ON MEDICAL MARIJUANA PRODUCTS; AND
 - (7) (a) Three days after the effective date of this subsection (7), the state treasurer shall transfer three million dollars from the general fund to the health research subaccount in the medical marijuana cash fund created in section 25-1.5-106 (17) for purposes of the grant program. The department may use up to three hundred thousand dollars to

9	of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this

12	November 2022 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
13	official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
