A BILL FOR AN ACT
CONCERNING MEDICAID REIMBURSEMENT FOR COMMUNITY HEALTH
WORKERS, AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, REDUCING AN
APPROPRIATION

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Joint Budget Committee. Under current law, community health workers may be reimbursed through the Colorado medical assistance program as long as the community health worker appears on the voluntary competency-based community health worker registry verifying that the community health worker completed state-approved training and

credentialing requirements.

The bill eliminates reimbursement for community health workers under the Colorado medical assistance program.

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general appropriation act for the 2025-26 state fiscal year to the department of health care policy and financing for medical and long-term care services for Medicaid-eligible individuals are adjusted as follows:

- (a) The general fund appropriation is decreased by \$2,729,115, which is subject to the "(M)" notation as defined in the annual general appropriation act for the same fiscal year; and
- (b) The cash funds appropriation from the healthcare affordability and sustainability fee cash fund created in section 25.5-4-402.4 (5)(a), C.R.S., is decreased by \$685,499.
- (4) The decreases of appropriations in subsection (3) of this section are based on the assumption that the anticipated amount of federal funds received for the 2025-26 state fiscal year by the department of health care policy and financing for medical and long-term care services for Medicaid-eligible individuals will decrease by \$8,012,075.
- **SECTION 4. Safety clause.** The general assembly finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety or for appropriations for the support and maintenance of the departments of the state and state institutions.

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
