A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING THE REQUIREMENTS TO OPERATE A MOTORBOAT IN THIS

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Current law requires an operator of a motorboat in the state to be at least 16 years of age but allows an individual who is at least 14 years of age and who has completed a motorboat safety course to operate a motorboat in the state.

The bill prohibits an individual under 16 years of age from operating a motorboat and requires any individual born after January 1,

1984, to take a boating safety course and have a certificate of completion from that course in the individual's possession in order to operate a motorboat.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, amend 33-13-107.1 3 as follows: 33-13-107.1. Minimum age of motorboat operators - penalty. 5 (1) No person under sixteen years of age AN INDIVIDUAL BORN AFTER 6 JANUARY 1, 1984, OR AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS UNDER SIXTEEN YEARS OF 7 AGE shall NOT operate a motorboat in this state except as provided in this 8 section. 9 (2) A person fourteen years of age or older who has not reached 10 his or her sixteenth birthday AN INDIVIDUAL BORN AFTER JANUARY 1, 11 1984, may operate a motorboat only if he or she THE INDIVIDUAL IS AT 12 LEAST SIXTEEN YEARS OF AGE AND: (a) Completes a boating safety course approved by the division of 13 14 parks and wildlife; and 15 (b) (I) Has Possesses a boating safety certificate issued by the 16 boating safety course provider. in his or her possession. 17 (II) WHILE OPERATING A MOTORBOAT, AN INDIVIDUAL REQUIRED 18 TO OBTAIN A BOATING SAFETY CERTIFICATE PURSUANT TO THIS 19 SUBSECTION (2) SHALL KEEP THE BOATING SAFETY CERTIFICATE IN THE 20 INDIVIDUAL'S IMMEDIATE POSSESSION OR IN AN ACCESSIBLE PLACE ON THE 21 MOTORBOAT. A COURT MAY WAIVE FINES INCURRED BY AN INDIVIDUAL 22 FOR NOT HAVING THE BOATING SAFETY CERTIFICATE IN THE INDIVIDUAL'S 23 POSSESSION OR IN AN ACCESSIBLE PLACE AT THE TIME OF OPERATING A 24 MOTORBOAT IF THE INDIVIDUAL IS ABLE TO PRESENT EVIDENCE TO THE

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COURT OF HAVING COMPLETED A BOATING SAFETY COURSE PRIOR TO THE INFRACTION.

- (3) No person AN INDIVIDUAL shall NOT permit or knowingly authorize a motorboat to be operated by a person under sixteen years of age AN INDIVIDUAL BORN AFTER JANUARY 1, 1984, OR AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS UNDER SIXTEEN YEARS OF AGE; except that a person fourteen years of age or older who has not reached his or her sixteenth birthday AN INDIVIDUAL BORN AFTER JANUARY 1, 1984, WHO IS AT LEAST SIXTEEN YEARS OF AGE may be permitted or authorized to operate a motorboat if he or she THE INDIVIDUAL has met the boating safety and certificate requirements of subsection (2) of this section.
- (4) No Neither an owner or operator of a vessel livery or NOR an agent or employee of such owner or operator shall lease, hire, or rent a motorboat to or for operation by any person under sixteen years of age INDIVIDUAL BORN AFTER JANUARY 1, 1984, OR AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS UNDER SIXTEEN YEARS OF AGE; except that a person fourteen years of age or older who has not reached his or her sixteenth birthday AN INDIVIDUAL BORN AFTER JANUARY 1, 1984, WHO IS AT LEAST SIXTEEN YEARS OF AGE, may be permitted or authorized to operate a motorboat if he or she THE INDIVIDUAL has met the boating safety and certificate requirements of subsection (2) of this section.
- (5) Any person INDIVIDUAL who violates this section commits a civil infraction and, upon conviction, thereof, shall be punished by a fine of one hundred dollars.
- (6) It is the intent of the general assembly that no general fund dollars SHALL NOT be appropriated for the purpose of implementing the requirements of this section.

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1	SECTION 2. Effective date - applicability. This act takes effect
2	June 1, 2024, and applies to conduct occurring on or after said date.
3	SECTION 3. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
4	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
5	preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.

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
