A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING CRITERIA RELATING TO THE OPERATION OF 102 TELEPHARMACY OUTLETS.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://leg.colorado.gov.)

Currently, a "telepharmacy outlet" must be located more than 20 miles from the nearest prescription drug outlet or other telepharmacy outlet. The bill removes this geographic restriction on the operation of telepharmacy outlets.

The bill authorizes the state board of pharmacy (board) to adopt limited rules concerning telepharmacy outlets.

8	(II) At the time of registration, is located more than twenty miles

10	outlet registered under this article 280;
11	(III) Is connected via computer link, video link, and audio link, or
12	via other functionally equivalent telecommunication equipment, with a
13	central pharmacy LOCATED IN THIS STATE that is registered under this
14	article 280; and
15	(b) The board may adopt rules as necessary to specify additional
16	criteria for a telepharmacy outlet that the board deems necessary.
