#### **Bill Summary**

**Joint Budget Committee.** The bill authorizes the use of money in the Colorado state titling and registration account to be appropriated to

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 42-1-211, amend (2) 3 as follows: 4 Colorado state titling and registration system. 42-1-211. 5 (2) There is hereby created the Colorado state titling and registration 6 account in the highway users tax fund for the purpose of providing funds: 7 For the development and operation of the Colorado state titling and 8 registration system, including operations performed under article 6 of this 9 title, and TITLE 42; to cover the costs of administration and enforcement 10 of the motorist insurance identification database program created in 11 section 42-7-604; Moneys AND TO PURCHASE AND ISSUE LICENSE PLATES, 12 DECALS, AND VALIDATING TABS IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE 3 OF THIS 13 TITLE 42. MONEY received from the fees imposed by section SECTIONS 14 38-29-138 (1), (2), (4), and (5), C.R.S., and sections 42-1-206 (2)(a), 15 42-3-107 (22), 42-3-213 (1)(b)(IV), 42-6-137 (1), (2), (4), (5), and (6), 16 and 42-3-304 (18)(d), as well as any moneys MONEY received through 17 gifts, grants, and donations to the account from private or public sources 18 for the purposes of this section, shall be credited by the state treasurer to 19 the Colorado state titling and registration account. The general assembly 20 shall appropriate annually the moneys MONEY in the Colorado state titling 21 and registration account for the purposes of this subsection (2). If any 22 unexpended and unencumbered moneys remain MONEY REMAINS in the 23 account at the end of a fiscal year, the balance remains in the fund and is 24 not transferred to the general fund or any other fund. 25 **SECTION 2.** Appropriation. (1) For the 2016-17 state fiscal

1	year, \$2,435,572 is appropriated to the department of revenue for use by
2	the division of motor vehicles. This appropriation consists of \$202,327
3	from the general fund, \$2,043,976 from the Colorado state titling and
4	registration account in the highway users tax fund created in section
5	42-1-211 (2), C.R.S., and \$189,269 from the license plate cash fund
6	created in section 42-3-301 (1)(b), C.R.S. To implement this act, the
7	division may use this appropriation for license plate ordering.
8	(2) For the 2016-17 state fiscal year, \$2,435,572 is appropriated
9	to the department of corrections for use by the Colorado correctional
10	industries. This appropriation is from reappropriated funds received from
11	the department of revenue under subsection (1) of this section. To
12	implement this act, Colorado correctional industries may use this
13	appropriation to provide license plate ordering services for the department
14	of revenue.
15	<b>SECTION </b> <u>3.</u> <b>Safety clause.</b> The general assembly hereby finds,
16	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
17	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
