The Department is authorized to transfer the savings of \$7,935,373 and the associated matching federal funds from administration line items to Medical Services Premiums for the purpose of supporting the most vulnerable hospitals, as identified by the Hospital Provider Fee Oversight and Advisory Board. If S.B. 17-267 should pass and authorize a Colorado Healthcare Affordability and Sustainability Enterprise, then the \$7,935,373 would be distributed to hospitals through the normal formula.
