**Summary of Legislation**

The bill allows a court-appointed special advocate (CASA) to provide independent and objective information about children and youth, instead of just children. Under current law, youth is defined as someone under the age of 21.

**Background**

CASA volunteers may be appointed by a court for any action under titles 14, 15, and 19 when the court finds it is in the interest of a child to have a volunteer appointed. [House Bill 21-1094](#) created the Foster Youth in Transition Program, which allowed eligible youth ages 18 to 21 to continue to receive foster care services on a voluntary basis.

**State Expenditures**

By adding youth to the definition of CASAs, the bill allows CASAs to be involved in cases with youth aged 18 to 21. While adding more cases where CASA volunteers may be involved will increase workload in the Judicial Department to process more documents and to add more volunteers to the case management system, this workload can be accomplished within existing resources. For context, there were 206 foster youth in transition cases in FY 2021-22 and 277 cases in FY 2022-23.

## **Effective Date**

The bill takes effect 90 days following adjournment of the General Assembly sine die, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
