BILL TOPIC: HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA ENDORSEMENT IN BILITERACY

NOTE: This bill was not enacted into law; therefore, the impacts identified in this analysis

do not take effect.

Summary of Legislation

The bill authorizes a school district, Board of Cooperative Educational Services (BOCES), or institute charter high school to grant a diploma endorsement in biliteracy to a student who demonstrates proficiency in English and at least one foreign language. The bill establishes the requirements a graduating high school student must meet to obtain the biliteracy endorsement.

School District Impact

The bill increases the workload for any school district, BOCES, or institute charter high school that chooses to offer an endorsement in biliteracy to its students. Districts will need to identify suitable assessments to measure foreign language proficiency, administer the assessment to candidates for a biliteracy endorsement, and note assessment results on a students transcript and endorsed diploma.

Under current law, school districts and Boards of Cooperative Educational Services (BOCES) may submit a separate estimate of fiscal impacts within seven days of a bill's introduction. Effective Date

The bill was postponed indefinitely by the Senate State, Veterans, and Military Affairs Committee on May 6, 2016.
